FATAL SHOOTING ACCIDENT
MONCTON, January 9—An accidental shooting accident occurred here last evening at 6.20 o'clock, when Joseph LeBlanc, aged 16 years, shot himself and died about thirty minutes afterwards.
Young LeBlanc was playing with a self-cocking .32 caliber revolver and was in the act of putting the weapon in his pants pocket when it suddenly discharged, the bullet entering his right side. Medical aid was quickly summoned but death followed soon after. Coroner Harris decided an inquest unnecessary.

LEAVE PRISON TO BE MARRIED.
SAN QUENTIN, Cal., Jan 9—The two prisoners who have known the inside of San Quentin's walls longer than any others there—a man and a woman—are to be paroled and given their freedom at the same time. Both are under sentence of life imprisonment for murder.
Their acquaintance with each other is slight, on account of the prison rules that segregate the women. Nevertheless, each has heard of the other by the mysterious "underground" of the penal institution, and it is expected that following their release they will become husband and wife.
The woman is Mary Von, who has been in the penitentiary since October 18, 1887, when she was received from Los Angeles, where she heard that he had another wife. She is known to the guards as a "crank."
The man is Charles H. Thorne, a second timer, who has been under sentence of life imprisonment for murder in Nevada country. He was remanded at San Quentin March 15.

DO YOU KNOW
Not to starch jabots and thin collars before ironing. Try using a half-teaspoonful of granulated sugar in a pan of water. Rinse the articles in this, wring out and roll in a towel for a short while. Then iron; and the jabots will look as if they had never lost their original dressing.
That housewives do not usually cook stewed tomatoes long enough and they often have a raw taste when served. Forty minutes is not too long to let them cook. Add two tablespoonfuls of dried bread crumbs to every quart. Add also about half a teaspoonful of sugar with pepper and salt to taste.
That a great deal can be saved by making your own dustless dusters by the following recipe: One-third ounce oil of paraffin mixed with one pint of coal oil. Wash a piece of black cheesecloth in this and you will have a dustless cloth harmless to any furniture. The above quantity makes three yards.
That when cleaning spots, to take the garment that is to be cleaned, and if there are spots on it, run a thread around them so as to be able to find them easily after the garment is wet and the spots not apparent.
That in making working aprons to make the hem nine or ten inches deep. Then, when the upper part of the apron wears out, the hem can be let out and substituted for the top, thus prolonging the garment's life.

A German physician who has been visiting this country is said to have declared that rising in our swift elevators is the cause of the increase of heart trouble in this country. He holds the involuntary catching of the breath when the elevator starts or stops as responsible.
Men who are suffering from heart disease have been kept at work longer because of the presence of the elevator than by any advance that there is in therapeutics. While the elevator is thus so important an adjunct for the heart so far as going up stairs is concerned, it is probable that most people would be benefited by walking down stairs occasionally.
A distinguished German authority in treatment of obesity has recommended walking down stairs rather rapidly as probably the best possible means of taking off surplus adipose tissue, and particularly that which collects in the abdominal region and is hard to remove by ordinary forms of exercise such as walking and the like. The gentle jolting motion tends to lead to the reabsorption of the fatty material that is accumulated.
Some American physicians have tried the suggestion on a number of patients with reported success. Besides this there is probably no better exercise for the ankle joints
