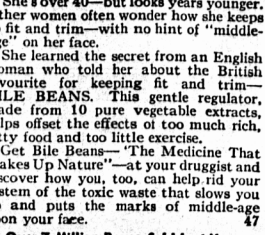

Poultry Jottings

Since our last jottings, the poultry industry in general on P.E.I. has been humming. Plans have now been completed for a monster Poultry meeting to be held September 21st.

This meeting is sponsored by the P.E.I. Poultry Industry Committee together with the Provincial and Dominion Departments of Agriculture. Noted speakers will deliver talks upon vital topics pertaining to the poultry industry, such speakers as W. A. Brown, Chief of Poultry Production and Marketing Services, Dominion Department of Agriculture, who probably more than anyone else has guided the purchase, assembling and shipping of Canadian eggs and poultry to the British market. Mr. Brown is intimately acquainted with P.E.I. He knows almost every point and place on the Island, having spent much time in the earlier years on work in connection with the poultry industry. He has spent

vacations here and delights to speak of those he knew years ago. Those who knew him in the days referred to will be pleased no doubt to meet him again.

Professor E. S. Snyder will give his address on Factors in Egg Quality. This is an illustrated address with beautifully prepared lantern slides. Professor Snyder has delivered this address in every Province in Canada except the Maritimes. At the conclusion of this meeting this year, all Provinces will have heard it. I have heard it twice and am looking forward to hearing it the third time. It is a most excellent address.

H. F. Williamson, Executive-Secretary, NEPCO Hatchery Division, Salisbury, Maryland, U.S.A., will speak upon the growth of the poultry industry in the Delaware district. You will hear first hand information about that district, its hatcheries and the part P.E.I. could expect to play in its future growth. "Bill" Williamson is a very fine speaker.

Mr. G. Scott, Director of the Poultry Administration, will speak on the Feed Outlook, a topic that will be of interest to poultrymen who may be wondering about future feed supplies.

P. E. Bernier, newly appointed Chief of R.O.P. Inspectors, speaking on the use of R.O.P. males in hatchery flocks will just fit in nicely with our new policy of having R.O.P. males head our hatcheries.

Other speakers will also be at hand. This meeting is one that all poultry producers should attend. It is your meeting. Make it a success, because, in doing so, you will benefit.

For the past few months, I have continually been hearing producers state to me what profits they have made this year from poultry. It has been a common thing to hear of four month old chickens dressing five lbs. A number of poultrymen have stated that they are
