LOUIS RETAINS TITLE WITH DECISION WIN

Champion Has Tough Time With Chilean In Hard, Crowding, 15-round Battle

(By Sid Feder, Associated Press Sports Writer) MADISON SQUARE GARDEN, New York, Feb. 9—(AP)—Joe Louis successfully defended his world heavyweight championship tonight by outpointing Arturo Godoy of Chile...

A chorus of boos greeted the decision, but it was a just one for Louis landed most of the punishing blows although he was baffled at times and was hurt on more than one occasion by Godoy's crowding, crouching style and hard lefts to the head and body.

Surprisingly the champion, who thus defended his crown for the ninth time, failed to score a knockdown against the 10 to 1 shot, who in pre-fight opinion had been figured to last less than 10 rounds.

Louis came on in the last five rounds after being held even over the first 10, to take the decision. The crowd was announced as 15,657, and the gross rate as \$88,523.

The South American way, going from the sublime to the ridiculous as portrayed by Godoy gave Louis the toughest battle of his championship, but wasn't enough to take the fistiana's highest crown from the Brown Bomber's kinky head.

Louis Befuddled

For 15 rounds, the champion was at times befuddled, and sometimes hurt by the Chilean's crouching, crowding tactics, but in the end he came on like a real "boss" to take a split decision in what Referee Donovan, who has been the third man in the ring for all the Bomber's battles here insisted was the "hardest, toughest" test Joe had ever had.

Yet, although Joe won cleanly and early, as the crowd of 15,657 roared to the bruising, mauling match, the real hero of the affair was the South American, who took the dusky dynamite's "Sunday punch" time after time and still came on, crowding Louis against the ropes and giving him trouble with long overhead lefts.

In the final analysis, it appeared the greatest knockdowner since Jack Dempsey—and rated by many as the greatest of the big men for all time—was no longer the killer in the ring. Max Schmeling and John Henry Lewis in less than a round, in ripping Tony Galento's face apart last summer, and in knocking up a string of eight consecutive title knockouts in his record run of nine consecutive title defenses.

Detroit Gets 3-0 Setback From Hawks

DETROIT, Feb. 9 (CP)—Chicago Black Hawks ended Detroit's eight-game unbeaten streak tonight, scoring a 3-0 shutout over the Red Wings in a National Hockey League contest.

By the victory, the Hawks firmied their grip on fourth place. Rookie Bill Carse counted two last-period goals while goalie Goodman came up with a dozen spectacular saves to insure the victory.

Prior to tonight Detroit had gone through eight straight games without defeat. The Black Hawks took the lead midway of the second period when Johnny Chad scored.

Rock-Chinned Challenger

It's true that the bobbing, bouncing Arturo of the Anas probably was a more rock-chinned challenger than any Joe has had to face to date, but the fact remains that Louis was 10 to 1 to flatten the South American long before the route had been run. And he not only failed to flatten him, but he didn't even come close to putting his pants on the floor.

The Associated Press score card gave Louis 10 rounds, including all of the last five, and voted Arturo, who didn't even have the least bit of fear of the champion's famed fistic exploits, five heads.

Referee Donovan voted in this way, too, while George Leon, one of the judges, handed 10 rounds to Louis, four to Arturo and one even. The other judge, Tommy Shortell, awarded the fight to Godoy, 10 rounds to five.

Boos greeted the decision from a great part of the crowd, which contributed to a gross rate of \$88,523. But this was regarded as largely a "sentimental expression" on the part of the faithful.

ROUND BY ROUND AS LOUIS WINS DECISION

Following is the round by round description of the fight:—

ROUND ONE

Louis fenced cautiously with his left hand as Godoy danced around in a crouch. Godoy landed a light jab on the nose. Louis bounced a left hook off the ears as Godoy went into a clinch. The champion was still boxing cautiously. Godoy, in close, hooked a left to the body, Louis bowed a straight left and a hard right off the jaw and took left and right to the mid-section. Godoy was crouching then coming in close to clinch. Louis' left-hook was high on the head, staggering Godoy. The Chilean backed Joe against the ropes and fired both hands to the head and body but Joe countered with a short right uppercut to the face. The right uppercut again connected. Louis smashed a right hand to the temple at the bell. Louis' round.

ROUND TWO

Godoy was still in his crouch. Suddenly he leaped in with a right hook to the body. Louis sparred at long range with a jab then hooked his left to the head. Godoy fired a hard left hook under the champion's eye, then hit Joe with another left on the jaw and a left to the body which the Bomber didn't like. Godoy cracked his right uppercut against the champion's nose, then he boked twice with his left to the head. Godoy leaped in with a slashing right to the chin which Louis fired a right left to the head and repeated as Godoy tossed both hands to Joe's ribs. In close they mangled away in a neutral corner. Godoy backing Joe against the ropes and refusing to give ground. Godoy smashed two hard lefts to the jaw and was still fighting after the bell sounded. Godoy' Round. The crowd howled in delight.

ROUND THREE

Joe sparred with his left hand and fended. Godoy jumped in with two short lefts to the body. Godoy backed Louis against the ropes and had the champion hurt from a two-fisted flurry which caused Louis to blink his eyes and hook on. Louis came out to punch with Godoy and they flatted away for half a minute as the crowd burst into an uproar. Godoy bounced a left hook off the head and took a hard right to the nose in return. Louis nailed Arturo with left and right but the Chilean crowded and clinched. Godoy backed the champion against the ropes and hit the head and body. Louis landed a left uppercut on the head, then they mangled in a neutral corner. Godoy backing the champion against the ropes and hit the head and body. Godoy failed to hear the bell and threw two punches after the round ended.

ROUND FOUR

Louis grazed Arturo's chin with a short uppercut then they clinched and mangled each other with left hands. Godoy banged the champion with a wild right swing to the head, then they both missed long lefts. Louis cracked the challenger with a short right uppercut, then snapped his head back with the same punch. He was catching Godoy's chin in this round with the right uppercut. Louis smashed a right hand to the body. Godoy backed the champion into a neutral corner and hit the head with two lefts which made Joe blink. At close range they were each doing considerable damage. Godoy with lefts to the face and this with his right uppercut. Louis as the champion remained backed in the neutral corner. Godoy's round.

ROUND FIVE

Godoy hit the champion with a left hook to the head and took two stinging lefts to the face in return. Louis landed two left hooks to the ear as Godoy kept crowding in. Louis again connected with his hand right uppercut, then Godoy backed him against the ropes and they fired away at each other. Godoy slashed a hard right hand off Joe's ear and Joe bounced off the Chilean's chin. Louis landed a straight left jab, then crossed his right with such force that Godoy's head snapped back. Louis whacked the challenger with another hard right uppercut. Joe fired left right and left at the head as Arturo crowded him against the ropes. Godoy swung a left to the body with left hands to the bell. Louis' Round.

ROUND SIX

Louis jabbed at the nose with his left hand. Godoy bounced a left off the ear. Louis moved off the ropes and landed a hard right cross under the eye. Godoy continued his crowding and fired lefts to the body. Godoy's left eye was swollen by the end of the round. Godoy worked with his left jab. The champion landed a terrific right cross to the jaw, then hit his man with left and right uppercut and Godoy held. Louis landed left and right to the head, then took two lefts to the body. Godoy bounced a left off the ear. Godoy swung a right uppercut to the chin again. Godoy fired left and right to the body in close. Louis then connected with his right uppercut and Godoy's crowding and crouching continued to give him trouble. Louis' round.

ROUND SEVEN

Louis jabbed with his left to the nose three times, then fired a hard right to the jaw. Godoy made Joe blink with three stiff left hands to the side of the chin. Godoy kept on crowding Joe against the ropes as they mangled in close. Godoy noked his left to the body. Again Godoy crowded Joe into the ropes and they mangled away. Louis

ROUND EIGHT

Godoy poked a left to the body as he backed Joe against the ropes. Louis fired his right uppercut to the chin which staggered Joe momentarily. They danced around for a few moments exchanging straight lefts. Louis cracked his right uppercut against the champion's nose, then he boked twice with his left to the head. Godoy leaped in with a slashing right to the chin which Louis fired a right left to the head and repeated as Godoy tossed both hands to Joe's ribs. In close they mangled away in a neutral corner. Godoy backing Joe against the ropes and refusing to give ground. Godoy smashed two hard lefts to the jaw and was still fighting after the bell sounded. Godoy' Round. The crowd howled in delight.

ROUND NINE

Louis fired a hard left to the body, then jabbed twice to the nose. Joe tossed a left jab and other in close. Godoy backed Louis against the ropes and hit the head and body. Godoy appeared to be hurt. Godoy continued backing the champion against the ropes and hit the head and body. American's eye. Godoy fired three lefts to the ribs against the ropes, then he stepped with two stiff left hooks to the head. Godoy hurt the champion with a hard right which hit as Arturo followed it up with left, right and left to the jaw at the bell and the crowd was positively hysterical. Godoy's Round.

ROUND TEN

Godoy appeared fresher as he came out in his crouch. He hit the heat. Louis landed a hard left hook on the chin as he danced away from Godoy's rush. Godoy straightened up momentarily and the crowd shouted "get down" as Louis nailed him with left jabs. Godoy tossed a left to the body, then took three punches to the head in return as Louis tried to dance away from his crowding rushes. Louis fired left and right long lefts. Godoy banged a left hook off the ear and a left to the body. Louis connected with three short uppercuts Godoy went back in his crouch, then backed Louis against the ropes and hit the champion six times on the head without a return. Louis landed a short right uppercut at the bell. Godoy's round.

ROUND ELEVEN

Louis bounced a straight left off the challenger's chin and again the crowd howled to Godoy to get down in his crouch. They exchanged stiff lefts to the ears. Godoy hit the champion with a left uppercut and Louis overhand right. Louis hit the challenger with three straight lefts as Godoy backed away. The jab was bothering Arturo, punches to the head in return as Louis tried to dance away from his crowding rushes. Louis fired left and right long lefts. Godoy banged a left hook off the ear and a left to the body. Louis connected with three short uppercuts Godoy went back in his crouch, then backed Louis against the ropes and hit the champion six times on the head without a return. Louis landed a short right uppercut at the bell. Godoy's round.

ROUND TWELVE

Godoy was standing in his corner when the bell sounded to start the round. Louis danced away from a rush and bounced left and right off Godoy's ears. Louis straightened the challenger up with two straight lefts but back came Godoy with a roundhouse hook to the jaw. Louis cracked a left to the chin as Godoy leaped in with a left to the ear, then repeated with a short left to the body. Godoy smashed the champion with a left uppercut to the stomach. Joe held momentarily, then bounced a left and a right off the jaw. Joe cracked a left off the ear as Godoy's left hand with another hard left to the stomach. Louis straightened his rival up with a right uppercut to the chin at the bell. Louis' round.

ROUND THIRTEEN

Godoy jumped off his stool and was hit with a right uppercut before the bell sounded. He was called back, then he rushed Joe to the ropes with a right to the body. Louis landed a left to the jaw and Godoy put one in the mid-section. Louis swung a right to the body and Godoy landed two lefts in the same place. Arturo was backing Joe into the ropes and Godoy cracked a stiff right against the chin. The crowd clapped and stamped in time as the action lagged momentarily. Louis caught Godoy with a short left coming in but Arturo countered with a left
