Kingston, Ont. had a curfew by-law for some years past. It became inoperative, nobody paying any attention to it, and has now been repealed.

Ireland's exodus still goes on despite the ameliorating influence of the Land Act and other beneficent measures. A circular has been issued by Cardinal Logue and Bishop Sheehan of the diocese of Waterford with a view to stem the tide of emigration, urging the people to stay at home and warning them against the perils of going to the United States.

A letter from Charles Yeo appeared in The Examiner of Saturday asking that in preparing the plans and erecting the new railway station consideration should be shown to our own architects, contractors and working men, and asks that those responsible for the patronage shall see that this is done as far as practicable. This seems a reasonable proposition and The Guardian will be glad to see it carried out.

Montreal has had an average of about 500 cases of typhoid fever yearly during the past five years, and the experts think the water supply is largely at fault. Of course this must be remedied at whatever cost, and the cost will be great. Charlottetown is fortunate in having what we believe to be the purest and most healthful water supply of any city in Canada, and is to be congratulated on the fact.

John Burns, the most noted representative of labor in the world, and who recently visited Canada, has been made President of the Local Government Board, (an important position) in the new Bannerman Cabinet. His appointment to this position is a tribute to his ability and character and is also a strong bid for the support of the working classes.

New Zealand has strongly sustained the Seddon Government at a general election. In a House of 72 the Ministerial party has 59 supporters and the Opposition party is reduced to 13.

The Montreal Witness is receiving hosts of testimonials and good wishes from prominent persons all over Canada on the occasion of its Diamond Jubilee. The Witness is an excellent journal and well deserves the flattering and appreciative words said in its favor.

JUST HOW WE STAND.

The following is an extract from a speech delivered by B. Hal. Brown, Manager of the London & Lancashire Life Insurance Co. for Canada:
