SUPREME COURT.

Rev. Edward Walker appellant vs Oliver Rattenbury respondent. The Court gave judgment allowing appeal and reversing judgment of the Court below. It might be stated that much new evidence was given in the Supreme Court which was not before the County Court judge. Judgment without costs.

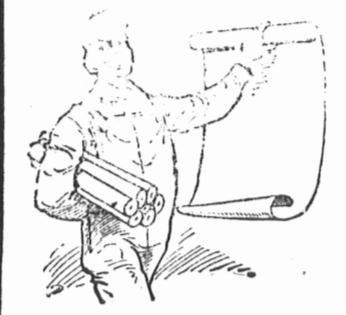
McLeod vs. Fraser an absent debtor. An appeal from a decision at Chambers whereby it was held not to be necessary to revive a judgment against an absent debtor at the expiration of ten years. The Court affirmed the judgment of Mr. Justice Hodgson at Chambers.

Norton vs. Smallwood. A demurrer judgment was given in favor of the defendant.

Thos. Kiekham vs. John Davison and Alfred Burke claimant—An interpleader matter. The Court gave judgment in favor of the claimant Burke barring the plaintiff proceeding further against the goods of defendant Davison set forth in the chattel mortgage.

McDonald vs. Robertson. An action of trespass tried at Georgetown before Mr. Justice Hodgson when judgment was given for plaintiff for \$250. Rule was argued last Michaelmas term. Judgment on Saturday was given reducing the damages from \$250 to nominal damages fixed at \$1. Mr. Justice Hodgson dissenting.

McDonald vs. Dodds. Action of ejectment tried before Mr. Justice Fitzgerald on Trinity term last when judgment was given for the whole of the lands claimed. A rule for non suit or new trial was argued

Alder Rrehaut of Georgetown Attorney at Law was appointed a commissioner for taking affidavits in the Supreme Court.
Certificates of naturalization were granted to Kirkwood Leck, of Sherwood, Lot 33 and Ronald McLean, Caledonia.
