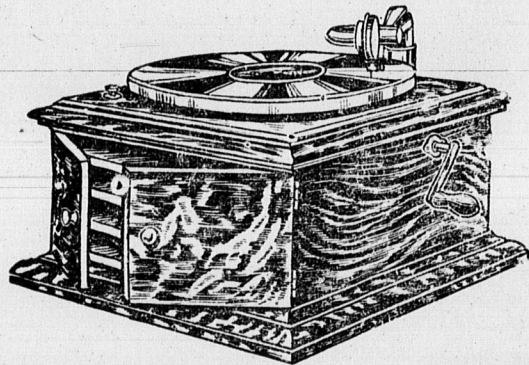

"IN ARTS OF TORTURE GERMANS OUTDO EVEN SAVAGE TRIBES"

That the press reports of German cruelties and barbaric atrocities are well substantiated are indicated by letters received from people living in France who have the opportunity to see and talk with wounded soldiers and men at the front. The Halifax Chronicle is able to print herewith excerpts from a letter written to a Wolfville lady by a lady friend in Paris who tells what she has seen and knows on the highest authority. Writing under date of October 18th, the writer who is a graduate of Acadia College says:

dia College says: "We can hardly realize as we lie down so calmly at night that a million German soldiers keen on cutting our throats are (some of them) only sixty miles away from us still. What a long time the battle of the Aisne has raged. You will pardon me if this is a war letter. As you can imagine, we think, talk and breathe nothing else. It is a matter, perhaps, of life or death to us, more especially as the Germans are now rabid against the "treacherous English" which the Kaiser has given orders to exterminate first of all.

GERMAN ATROCITIES HORRIBLE.

"The ultimate success is certain, and may Germany pay (though she cannot) the havoc she has wrought. Please, if you care anything for me, don't believe those rumors circulated by a paid press, to curry favor with the United States, that French and not Germans are committing the atrocities. I have seen enough with my own eyes to convince me that all they tell is only too true. It is horrible, horrible; you cannot imagine it. I have been to trains bringing in wounded, sometimes 500 on board, sometimes 300, and talked with those poor dying men, men who have no object or desire to blacken the German. They tell me the truth and you can justly believe all you read about them. Today I have come from a visit to a poor woman who got word that her husband, severely wounded is lying in a hospital near by. She has been to see him several times and is greatly distressed by his depression. She does not know that when the bandage is removed from his face she will see a fresh bit of German butchery. Lying among the wounded he and almost fifty village men had their noses and ears cut off by jostling German soldiers. In certain villages all the male children have been mutilated. @

YOUNG GIRL CRUCIFIED.

"Yesterday a friend of ours, a French Lieutenant just arrived from the battlefield, he had been driving a captain— in his car to the front near Rheims, he tells us that they were spinning along when the English captain asked him to stop, to examine something in the woods. They did so, only to discover a handsome young girl, naked, her breasts cut off, crucified by the Germans on a tree. He says that some of the atrocities defy description. For instance in a little Belgian village which the Germans took near Mathenes the officers arrested all the men as prisoners. When they came to one little house the mother on her knees implored the Germans to spare her husband, saying she had eight children, 'Eight children,' said the man, feigning not to believe, 'show them to me.' They did so. The next instant, the man had them lined up against a wall, and before the bound parents shot down five of them. When their little bodies had fallen, he turned to the mother, 'Now madam, that leaves you only three to look after. I think you can get along without your husband.'

OUTDO EVEN SAVAGE TRIBES

"This is their 'kultur' that they talk so much about. No, in arts of torture I think they outdo even the most savage tribe. The world would be well rid of everyone of them. But we cannot exterminate them and they breed like rabbits. What is to be done? It seems cruel, but my hope is that the Russians, who have the reputation of being pretty good murderers, will make rapid advances and give the Germans a sample of what their army is doing here. — has a great many English wounded at present, as the place, being full of large buildings and shady grounds, is well adapted for hospitals. Just around the corner from us is a building which was only completed a few weeks ago, and was to have been officially opened last week. That is now a hospital for the Tommies, and is in charge of the American colonel here. There are, unfortunately, many of them seriously wounded, and four or five funerals a day from that place alone. Today I saw the Garde Municipale passing, so that means

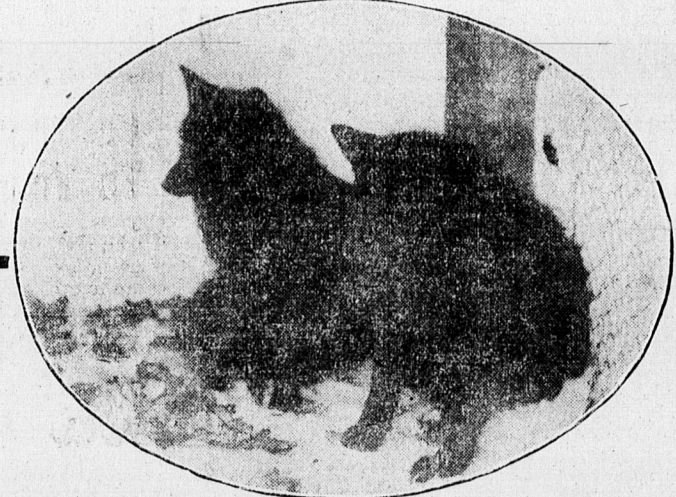
