In Memoriam

MRS. R.H. GORDON

The many friends of Mrs. R.H. Gordon learned with deep regret of her death which occurred in Alberton on Monday, April 21st. Mrs. Gordon, oldest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Champlion, was born at Alberton sixty-nine years ago. She graduated from the Massachusetts General Hospital and for some years was assistant superintendent at Corey Hill Hospital. In 1915 she was married to Mr. R.H. Gordon of Montrose. Six years ago Mr. and Mrs. Gordon moved to Alberton where they have since resided.

During the years she lived in Montrose Mrs. Gordon was ever ready to give assistance in times of illness. Many people in that rural community remember with gratitude the soothing touch and the skillful care of a well trained nurse.

For a number of years Mrs. Gordon had not enjoyed good health and for the past six months had been confined to her home. Her firm Christian faith enabled her to live through this long period of ill health and inactivity with high courage and unfailing patience. Mrs. Gordon has always been associated with the Church — first with the Church of England and later with the United Church of Canada — and was a valued member of the Woman's Missionary Society. For many qualities she was loved and admired but by those who knew her well she will be remembered especially for her kind, sympathetic nature.

The funeral service was conducted by her pastor, Rev. J.M. Fraser, assisted by Rev. J.W. Nowe who read the Scripture and Rev. W.I. MacDonald who led in prayer. Hymns sung were "Ereathie on Me, Breath of God," and "Safe in the Arms of Jesus." Mrs. John Wells sang very beautifully "The City Four-square." Interment was in St. Peter's Anglican cemetery, Alberton.

Beautiful flowers bore silent testimony to the esteem in which Mrs. Gordon was held. Pallbearers were Messrs. Ned Barbour, Gordon Barbour, Watson Hardy, J.W. Waugh, Howard Clark and Heber Corbett.
