LARGE MEETING HELD AT DUNDAS

A Strong Agitation for a Branch Railway

Prominent Men Present at the Meeting—A Memorial will be Forwarded to Ottawa Setting Forth the Needs of the Section.

Pursuant to notice a large number of the leading business men, and farmers, of Dundas, Annandale, Bay Fortune and Little Pond, met in the hall at Bridge town on the 7th inst. to consider pressing our demands for better railway facilities throughout Central Kings. When the meeting was called to order by appointing J C Underhay to act as chairman the following were present, viz: Jas E McDonald, M L A, W A O Morson M L A, Hon D Gordon, M L A, A J McDonald, M L A, N McLaren, John Howlett, J K McDonald, Charles Clay, Thos Clay, William McLeod, among others who came a long distance to attend, thus showing how strong the feeling is about the matter in the sections interested. Letters of regret were read by the Secretary from J J Hughes M P and Senator Robertson. The chairman in his usual happy manner outlined the object of the meeting, and from his large knowledge of the country through which the proposed line would pass gave it as his opinion that there would be very few natural obstacles to be surmounted.

Mr. William McLeod spoke strongly in favor of running a line from Bear River to Cardigan via Annandale, in which he was supported by Charles Clay.

W A O Morson M L A expressed himself as willing to give all possible aid to the work as also did Hon D. Gordon, and A J McDonald, and N McLaren. Jas E McDonald, M L A while willing to support the movement, strongly urged on the people present the necessity of having the harbors improved by dredging and getting the Governments to repair the wharves so that when farmers are compelled to burn coal they would be able to get it handled cheaply.

Geo E Saville spoke in favor of having the proposed line run on to East Point and that the Farmers' Institutes should agitate to have Grand River Bar dredged the coming season.

John Howlett also spoke strongly in favor of dredging the Bar and placing a bridge at Annandale and a steam ferry on Cardigan River.

Thomas Clay contended that the tunnel was the crying necessity at present.

G A Clay also claimed that a strong and persistent agitation would bring the tunnel, and claimed that P E Island was the wealthiest Province of the Dominion for its size and our people were too long suffering for their own good.

J K McDonald and J B Campbell advocated asking for something moderate, as it would be most easily got. The following resolutions were then submitted and adopted viz:

That our representative at Ottawa be instructed to demand that a survey of a line of railway from Cardigan to Dundas, thence along the river to Annandale, thence through by way of Little Pond to Dingwell's Mills and to join the Souris line at Bear River be made during the coming summer, and that an estimate of such a road be furnished to the public at completion of survey.

Charles Clay and A Currie were appointed to draw up a memorial to be signed by the people interested and forwarded to Ottawa requesting that the present mail route from Cardigan to Annandale be divided at Dundas.

A resolution brought in by Neil McKay asking that the railway superintendent be asked to place an express train on the Eastern Branch two days of the week was also carried.

The meeting was brought to a close by passing a vote of thanks to the chairman and to the gentlemen from other places who so kindly attended. The people of Central Kings are bound to have a railroad, as the tract of country interested is the most thickly populated and prosperous section of Kings County, and moreover it would make it much more convenient for the Eastern business men shipping goods to Georgetown in the winter season, as it would save the long haul around by Mount Stewart.

NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTES AGAINST WOMAN SUFFRAGE.

MANCHESTER, N. H. March 10.—Returns from the general vote on 10 constitutional amendments indicate the adoption of at least seven. State voted 2 to 1 against women suffrage but has apparently adopted an anti-trust amendment.
