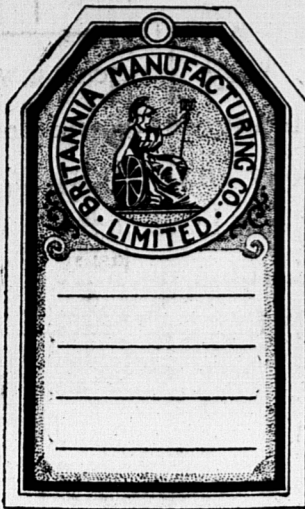

## The latest news, first of all.

The interment was at Clifton, New London. The pall-bearers were James McKay and D. N. McKay, Springfield Thomas Robins, Jesse Schurman, William Calbeck and Thomas Moysie, Bedouque. The large number of people that attended attested to the esteem in which the deceased was held.

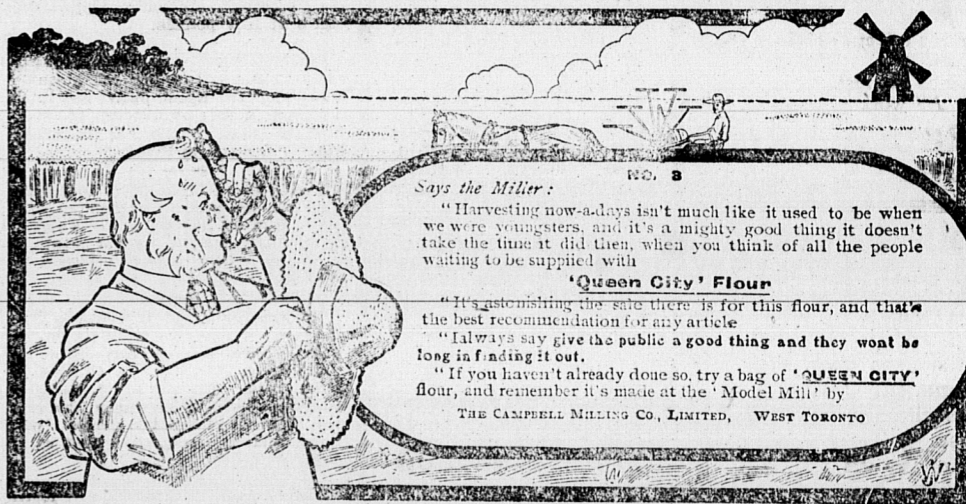
