**LOSSES DUE TO SMOKE**

(Rochester Democrat and Chronicle). The loss due to soft coal smoke cost the city of Cleveland \$6,000,000 a year—\$12 per capita, or more than \$40 a family. These are the figures presented by a committee of the chamber of commerce which has been for some time investigating the subject. The items which make up this total include the increased mortality due to breathing impure atmospheric losses to plant life, the greatly increased cost of cleaning and housekeeping and the heavy direct loss to the consumer due to the imperfect combustion of coal. Experiments conducted under the direction of the government prove that when a heavy black cloud of smoke pours from a factory chimney it is a sign of waste, as much so as though from five to ten per cent of the coal purchased was thrown on the ash pile. A saving of \$5,000 a year has been effected at the heating plant of the University of Illinois by the use of smoke consumers and the employment of men trained in boiler room efficiency. The manufacturer who does more than pollute the atmosphere and endanger health—he is throwing away coal.

**COMMERCIALIZING THE AIR LINES**

The proposal to operate airship service from New York to Chicago which Captain Baldwin makes under the inspiration of the Zeppelin feat in Germany, many seem to be indeed the opening of a new era in transportation, but let us be moderate in our language about it. The Zeppelin company made its first commercial trip recently. It was not the no table flight from Lake Constance to Dusseldorf, because on that occasion the passengers were invited guests but a three-hour trip, for which twenty passengers paid real money. On this occasion, as on the first, the airship made an average of thirty three miles an hour. The passengers paid \$50 each. It carried 100 miles. Taking the distance between New York and Chicago at 900 miles, which is the shortest railroad mileage, the corresponding fare for the trip would come to \$454. How many persons would pay \$454 to be carried from the Atlantic to Lake Michigan, through the air in twenty-seven hours, when they may be carried to the same point by rail in twenty-two hours for \$20?
