Finance

NEW YORK, March 25 (AP)—Buying and selling activities were both under restraint in today's stock market but near the close offerings outran demand and leaders fell fractions to around a point. A dip of 2 of a point in the Associated Press 60-stock average erased the previous day's gains and left the composite at 34.9. Dealings totaled 315,345 shares compared with yesterday's 303,558. Canadian stocks were uneven. International Nickel common declined 1-2 while preferred shares were unchanged. Distillers Seagram and Imperial Oil lost 1-8 and Dome Mines 1-2. Walkers advanced 1-2. McIntyre Mines 5-8. Hollinger 1-4. Canadian Pacific ended unchanged. Stocks in the less division at the finish included U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, Goodrich, U.S. Rubber, pfd., United Aircraft, American Telephone, Westinghouse, Johns-Manville, DuPont, Texas Co and Santa Fe. Air Reduction, Cerro de Pasco and Allied Chemical emerged with moderate gains.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, March 25 (CP)—Industrials made a rallying gesture today on the stock exchange but trading trends in other directions was along irregular lines. Firmer in industrials were Canadian Car preferred, Foundation, Asbestos, Hamilton Bridge and Building Products, International Bronze and Ottawa. Car were shaded but Dosco "B" wiped out a loss. C.P.R. moved up in carriers and Winnipeg Electric "A" was improved in utilities. Hudson Bay Mining did better in metals and Noranda dipped to a new low. Distillers-Seagram and Regent Knitting posted increases in miscellaneous and Celanese, Ogden Flour and Canadian Foreign Investment were losers. Total sales: 14,400 shares; Industrials, 10,500; Mines, 3,900.

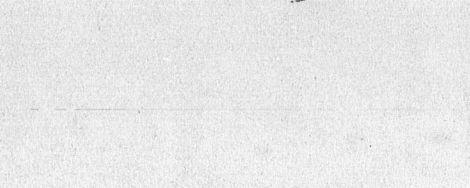

Currencies

NEW YORK, March 25 (CP)—The pound sterling gained 1-4 of a cent in today's foreign exchange dealings to close at \$4.04 in relation to the United States dollar. The Canadian dollar finished unchanged at a discount of 12 7-8 per cent after being higher most of the day. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.08-9.91 per cent discount.)

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, March 25 (CP)—The Mining stocks look a moderate move forward today on the Toronto exchange after displaying weakness over a period of two weeks. The golds made the best showing, advancing 3/8 on good volume while the base metal issues gained 1/16 on comparatively light turnover. Industrials and western oils posted insignificant losses. Aggregate turnover at 100,000 shares was down from that of the previous session by 46,000 shares. In today's action the turnover was quite heavy in a half-dozen of the secondary golds, chiefly those that had been depressed by active selling in recent issues. Preston changed hands in quantity of 11,000 shares and advanced 12 cents to 1.76. Malartic Gold Fields traded 10,000 shares and gained 10 cents to 1.25 and Kerr-Adams traded 7,700 shares and gained 15 cents to 3.10. Weak spots persisted here and there. Buffalo-Ankerite was down 35 cents to 1.90, Anglo-Huronian was off 26 cents to 1.75, Beattie lost 10 cents to 60. Several of the higher-price industrials slipped back for losses in points while trading in small volume. Goodyear Tire fell 7 3-4 to 32 on turnover of 10 shares. Senior base metals, Nickel, Noranda and Smelters, recorded fractional gains and Steep Rock advanced 7 cents to 1.60. In the western oils, Calgary and Edmontion was down 2 to \$1. Brown and South End Petroleum dropped fractions.
