THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

Active Temperance Work.

SIR.—As the columns of THE GUARDIAN are ever open to a fair expression of opinion on any question of public interest, I wish to add this to the many contributions which are appearing therein, on the great question of temperance reform which should be paramount in the mind of the electors of Canada today.

First I wish to express my great appreciation of the manner in which THE GUARDIAN has ever dealt with this question, and its strict adherence to principle.

During the late plebiscite campaign we met with little or no opposition from the rum party in this province. They retreated before our weapons of argument which were wielded vigorously from pulpit, platform and press throughout the land. The barricades which the enemy placed in the way of the temperance forces were everywhere overcome and when the vote was taken victory was ours. But the prohibition flag has not yet floated over the headquarters of our government. The enemy has retreated only to take up stronger position.

The city of Charlottetown, where the liquor favourites were ever strong, although until recently without protection has been converted into one of the strongholds of this giant evil. There moral support and protection is given to the traffic by the government. There all her best sentiments from the pleadings of her mothers and wives, and the warnings of conscience in many a poor individual, produce but an echo from the lofty rampart of the license law.

Its influence reaches also to the country districts. The friends of the traffic are taking on an air of defiance which they had never before assumed, feeling that if they got the Government to their back what need they fear. But the storm is yet to come the blow is to be struck at headquarters. We have a most formidable weapon in the ballot. Before this question all other political questions now before the country sink into insignificance.

Now is the time to bring forth the proper men to legislate for us to support those who have deceived the people. I care not of what party they are so long as they have a true sense of right. The enemy is strongly entrenched I believe in both parties, there also appear many who are true supporters of our cause. We want more of the latter in our legislative halls and I would ask the temperance works of either party to use their influence to the end that the right kind of men are nominated. When the liberal party adopted the holding of a plebiscite as a part of their platform they must surely have thought that should it ever come to an issue the cause would be lost. Their subsequent action would lead us to this belief. For when the campaign was over they refused us that triumphal march which was ours by right.

I greatly commend the action of the Dominion Alliance and trust that all sympathisers with the cause will avail themselves of this opportunity of wielding a deadly weapon against the enemy.

The Victoria Times of Nov. 25 says: "It has gone abroad," said Mr. Cunningham, "that Alex. McDonald is a poor man again; that he is 'busted', as they say. 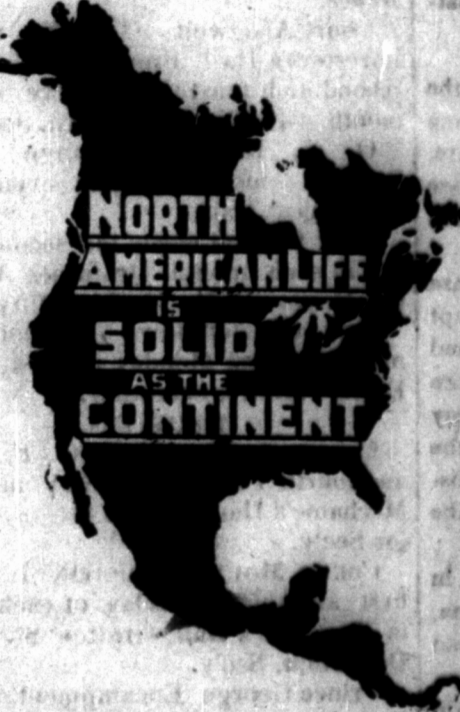
