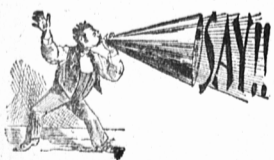

EXHIBITION AND RACES.

At the recent annual meeting of the Exhibition Directors a good choice was made of executive officers with Hon. F. L. Hassard as President and C. R. Smallwood as Secretary.

There will be three days of horse racing, the extra day affording some safeguard against a possible rainy day.

These races will be open to all horses owned in Canada or Newfoundland previous to May 1, 1906, and entries will close June 15 next with the Secretary, C. R. Smallwood, Charlottetown.

There is a doubt in some minds as to the prominence given to horse racing at Exhibitions, and there has been a good deal of discussion in the west recently in which a separation of the racing feature has been advocated.

The Exhibition Prize List is now being prepared and will be made ready as speedily as possible. It is the intention of the management to make the Exhibition of this year the best ever held here.

THE LATE HON. ANGUS McMILLAN.

Hon. Angus McMillan has passed away at the good old age of eighty-nine years. In his time he had filled a prominent place in the industrial and political life of Prince County.

His political career began with his election to the Legislature from Summerside in 1869. He was re-elected in 1877, 1879, 1880 and 1883.

Mr. McMillan in addition to other public positions held by him was President of the Summerside Bank down to the date of its absorption by the Bank of New Brunswick a few years ago.

It is understood that the Lord's Day Act which will be dealt with by Parliament at the present session will follow closely the draft prepared last year by the Lord's Day Alliance, and which in addition to the approval of the Protestant churches has been endorsed by all the Bishops and Archbishops of the Roman Catholic body in Canada.

SIX HUNDRED MEN WERE SLAUGHTERED

Severe Engagement at Manila, in Which Many Americans Were Killed—The United States Troops Lost Heavily Storming a Strongly Fortified Position.

MANILA, March 12.—An important action between American forces and hostile Moros has taken place near Jolo. Fifteen enlisted men were killed, a commissioned officer was wounded, four enlisted men were wounded and a naval contingent operating with the military sustained 32 casualties.

Major General Leonard Wood, commander of the division of the Philippines, reports as follows, from Jolo, capital of the Sulu-Islands.

"A severe action between troops, a naval detachment and constabulary and hostile Moros has taken place at Mount Dajo, near Jolo.
