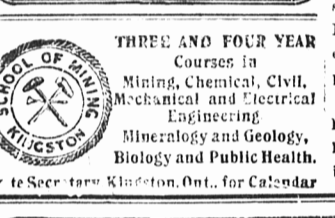

FRANCE AS A PEACE MAKER.

While the difficulty between Britain and Russia over the North Sea outrage was at its worst, France was acting the part of a peacemaker with earnest and friendly effort. It seems reasonable to suppose that the fact of her alliance with Russia may have increased the desire of France to prevent an open rupture between her ally and Britain. It is generally believed that the terms of the Dual Alliance require each of the parties thereto come to the rescue of the other in the event of such other being involved in war with more than a single power.

If such are the terms of the alliance a war between Russia and Britain would mean either that France should also draw the sword against Britain or prove faithless to her treaty obligations. France and her Government are alike friendly to Britain at the present time. They do not want war, and especially a struggle with the greatest of the war-time powers, as such a conflict most prove ruinous to French commerce, and would involve enormous burdens upon the French people.

With Russia it is different. She has little trade upon the great waters, and her vast, compact territories are almost impervious to successful attack by sea or land. It might have suited the purpose of Russia to precipitate a general war, embroiling other nations in the hope of gaining support, or of retrieving her defeat and humiliation in the east. The danger to France was that she might be thus compelled to engage in a certainly costly and possibly ruinous war entirely against her interests and her wishes.

There was still another reason why the Government of France was most desirous to preserve the peace. The Dual Alliance with Russia had been entered upon at a time when France stood isolated and alone in Europe. The treaty was made by responsible ministers, but its terms being secret, it had not been submitted to the French Parliament. Were France by the terms of such a treaty to be forced into an unpopular war there was great danger of a division among her own people at home, the rejection of the Government and serious trouble, or perhaps a revolution. It is easy to see how earnestly France would use her friendly offices with both Britain and Russia to effect a peaceful settlement of the grave trouble that had so suddenly arisen.

ELECTION NEWS SERVICE.

A feature of the evening following the day of election was the promptness and completeness with which the telephone and telegraph companies respectively supplied the news of the contest from all parts of the Dominion to the press and the party committee rooms. For the first time in the Island's history we were in that regard placed on an equal footing with other Provinces of Canada in the way of receiving early news from a vast number of polls.

For the news from the different polls about the Island the press and the general public are indebted on this occasion to the P. E. Island Telephone Company which performed the arduous task quite gratuitously and with painstaking promptness and accuracy. The telegraph service also was most prompt and satisfactory delivering the news from the Mainland Provinces much earlier than at any previous election and in such volume as would have taxed the capacity of any service anywhere doing business over a single cable and land wire.

The despatches received by The Guardian giving the election news from the Mainland would if printed in full have filled our pages to the exclusion of all other reading matter. Thousands upon thousands of words came rolling in from hour to hour through the night telling who was elected, or who was leading, and how many polls were yet to be heard from in any one of a hundred electoral divisions. The news of the sensational result in St. John was conveyed to The Guardian at six o'clock, which was before the result in a single Island county was known.

It affords us great pleasure therefore to congratulate Superintendent James and his staff of the Argyle-American, and Manager Winfield and the Telephone Company's staff for the efficient and satisfactory manner in which they gathered and delivered the news of the elections. It left nothing to be desired. This acknowledgment would have been made yesterday but for the stress of work, which is always very great in the office of a morning newspaper at such times.

THE RESULT IN QUEEN'S.

The result of the election in Queen's County transferred two seats from the Liberal to the Conservative column has been naturally disappointing to the Ministerial party and a source of elation to the Opposition. It is the more remarkable because it occurs at a time when the Government is sustained by a very large majority throughout the Dominion. Beyond question local causes contributed to the result, and among these causes are several of which the Administration had received faithful warning in these columns. These warnings were given, it is needless to say, in the public interest and not for the benefit of any political party.

It was a great mistake not to have made the appointment of Lieutenant Governor at the expiry of Governor McIntyre's term. It was another mistake to have left open the location of the railway station and the extension of the railway track along the harbor front. The telegraph matter was left unsettled too long for the great improvement therein effected to be realized by the general public. These are less ones which we trust may be laid to heart by the party in power. By delays, and by keeping the public mind in suspense in regard to the matters above referred to, the Liberal candidates, by no fault of their own were seriously handicapped.

Judge Warburton was well and favorably known, and almost every one has a kindly feeling for Mr. Prowse who is personally a very strong and popular man. But they were too late getting in the field, and the work of organization was necessarily hurried and incomplete. Organization cannot go on till the candidates are in sight. On the Conservative side the candidates were long in the field and their organization was perhaps the best ever put up in a Queen's County election. We deem it proper to mention these local circumstances as having a most important bearing upon the Queen's County election, apart from the larger questions of the public policy of the two great political parties.
