## Latest News of the City and Province.

### By Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

THE GUARDIAN is for sale at Mr. R. H. Mason's News Depot on Queen Street in the store formerly occupied by Morris and Jost.

The many friends of Miss Bertie Myers, who has been quite ill for the past two weeks, will be glad to learn that she is recovering.

A Liberal Mass Meeting will be held tonight in the Market Hall. The meeting will be addressed by Messrs. Ger. E. Hughes, John F. Whear, Sir Louis Davies, Premier Farquharson and others. The chair will be taken at 8 o'clock.

Mr. GEORGE CARVER left the city Monday, returning yesterday with 20 barrels of fine hand-picked oysters. This is the largest lot of oysters in the city and can be had at his up-to-date restaurant on Queen Street, next R. K. Bruce's.

THE GUARDIAN is pleased to learn that Mr. M. McLeod of Bozeman, Montana, has been appointed Deputy Clerk of the Court of the Judicial District in which he lives. The district comprises some three counties. The position is for four years and pays a large annual salary. It is pleasing at all times to learn of the success of the sons of this province and Mr. McLeod's appointment is another recognition of the singular ability possessed by those who go from our shores.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND potatoes are selling at the wharf for 30 cents, a figure about two cents higher than the price that ruled at the corresponding season last year. Nova Scotia potatoes command about 10 cents a bushel more. The Island crop has not yet presented itself here in quite as large a quantity as usual for this season. There has been no shipments to Boston. Other produce is in stock in the usual supply. Eggs are getting up pretty near the top notch. P. E. Island stock selling in jobbing lots at 18c. and Nova Scotia at 20c. The scarcity of dairy butter continues and the prices stiff. The scarcity is confined not merely in Nova Scotia but from Ontario and Quebec the same word comes. Creamery prints wholesale at 25c. Our supplies of heavy beef are still drawn from Nova Scotia at considerably higher prices than a year ago. But the dealers are not able to import from Ontario. They say, however, that there is a strong likelihood that after the beginning of the year such importations may be possible for them. This remains to be seen. Oats are a shade stiffer than at the last quotations, but there is no change in feed products. Hay is steady, and the temporary shortage in straw noticed a couple of weeks ago owing to the difficulty of moving it has passed away. P. E. Island oats are quoted at 30 cents.—Halifax Herald.

SEARLETON NOTES.—The mild weather of the past two weeks has proved quite a boon to farmers enabling them to fit up for the coming winter. The matrimonial fever still rages, not so much in Searleton as in adjoining localities. We cannot say that it causes so much trouble in the elements or weather but think it should be attributed to the wind raised by our local politicians the fact remains we have had some pretty rough weather. Our would-be members are stumping the district with a zeal worthy of a better cause and successes do most political campaigns in throwing a good deal of mud and convincing their hearers that the vast difference existing between the two parties amounts to twiddle dum and twiddle dee. About a year ago she removed to Boston and after spending some months here her friends, noticed that sickness was shutting down upon her spirit like a dark cloud, preventing her usual buoyancy and joyfulness, changing work into weariness, making the attempts toward duty sorrowful by a perpetual consciousness that life was deserting her and that soon she would be called to be with her Saviour.
