### CONCRETE AND SAWDUST FLOORS FOR WARMTH

Proof that warmer floors can be made by mixing sawdust with cement has been furnished by scientists. The floors, while not as hard as those obtained by using pure concrete, are hard and strong enough, scientists say.

The cost of the flooring is more expensive due to the necessity of having to use more cement and less sand with the sawdust.

The new flooring will be of aid to business but will have its greatest success among the farmers. It is expected to supplant the concrete flooring now used in dairies.
