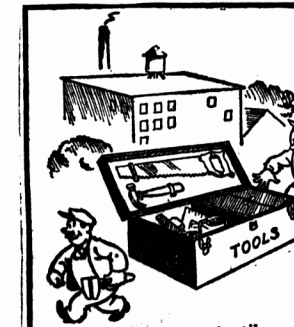

U. S. Committee on Rubber Makes Report

WASHINGTON, March 19 - (AP)—A program aimed to insure that the United States never again will be caught short of rubber was set forth tonight by a government rubber policy committee.

The report was made public by Office of War Mobilization and the Reconstruction. The committee directed its recommendations into two groups, one for the "short-run" and one for the "long-run" program.

The short-term recommendations include one that, in order to distribute natural rubber supplies equitably throughout the world, international pooling and allocation of natural rubber should be continued.
