PARIS, April 8-(Reuters)-The Socialist newspaper Populaire Anglo-French alliance, even though the two countries might not be in agreement on every subject, was made by Socialist President Felix Gouin at Strasbourg.

The Anglo-French alliance is a trustworthy proposition on which we can unhesitatingly rely," Populaire said.

"Britain would not turn her back on us in the hour of peril nor abandon us in the midst of our fight."

The Communist Humanite called for greater understanding of French needs. Denouncing what it regarded as excessive British tenderness for German and Italian interests, its editorial concluded:

"Dear friends, spare us a little consideration for France. Have a reasonable understanding of her vital need."

"Then we will seal an alliance which is desired by our people, but on equal terms."

Pope Sees World Suffering From Lack Of Religion

VATICAN CITY, April 7-(AP)-Pope Pius XII in a Spanish language broadcast to the cathedral congress at Barcelona said today that the world was "suffering from many painful ills, but that few of these ills were as important as the ignorance of religion."

"Jesus Christ and His Church still are for many actually unknown, how can they be loved and followed?" the Pontiff said.

"If God is not known, if His law is not observed, why should we find it strange that history can be traced by a succession of catastrophes?" He urged the energetic propagation of the Roman Catholic doctrine, adding that parents, teachers and priests everywhere must instill in new generations the Christian spirit.

"The peace of the future must be built upon them, the only peace which has a name, which is a Christian peace."

He sent his blessings for the Congress and "for all of Catholicism, always an object of special affection from the vicar of Christ."

Bytown Castle Now Home Of Royalty

OTTAWA, April 8-(CP)-This year it caused only a passing comment when dozens of farmers brought their wagons to the grist and saw mill Thomas MacKay had at the point where the Rideau sent its eternal curtain of water down into the Ottawa.

The mill was built by the late Mr. MacKay, a 2400-acre estate and atmosphere that later was characterized as "a sub-Arctic village converted by royal mandate into a political cockpit."

Will Hold Series Of Civil Service Examinations

OTTAWA, Ont., April 8-(Special)-The policy of providing veterans of the war just ended every opportunity to qualify for Dominion service jobs, the Civil Service Commission is holding a series of examinations this spring and summer every large urban centre from Prince Edward Island to British Columbia.

Commissioner Stanley Nelson said today that he expected there would be tens of thousands of veterans seeking to qualify for positions with the post office staff whose personnel is dangerously near an absolute minimum.

There are many vacancies for such jobs as postal and railway mail clerks, letter-carriers, and clerks. Many more will become open in the near future since a large percentage of veterans of the war in the department are nearing the retirement age or getting transfers to less strenuous work than delivering mail.

Impending restoration of the twice-a-day delivery of mail in Canadian cities will also boost the post office department's requirements and provide more permanent jobs for veterans.

To Ask Probe Of Butter Situation

SYDNEY, N.S., April 8-(CP)-The Cape Breton Labor Council decided at a meeting Sunday to ask for an investigation into the butter supply situation in Canada and into the amount of butter exported to Newfoundland and the West Indies. The decision was made after the Council rejected by a 194 vote a motion calling for strike action by Cape Breton County industrial workers to protest the butter shortage. D.D. Barrett, manager of the Cape Breton division of the Prices Board, who attended the meeting, announced that 20,000 pounds of butter, additional to the industrial area's weekly allotment, would be shipped in this week. Barrett said there were regular shipments of Canadian butter to Newfoundland although the "did not believe it was very large." He said he knew of no shipments of Canadian butter to the West Indies. Barrett spoke after speakers at the meeting said butter was being shipped to the West Indies and Newfoundland to take advantage of higher prices there.
