"Money talks", quite as loudly to the farmer as to any other class. Today the farmer is fully conversant with the trend of the market, prevailing prices, and supply and demand.

There are some engaged in the hog business who do not see or appreciate the full value of grading. The question must be considered in a broad sense, because the actual market requirement, domestic and export, are the basis for all standards covered by the regulations under the Live Stock and Live Stock Products Act.

In the production of bacon hogs, the farmer's objective is "selects", because that grade is in demand, and commands the highest price. There is no doubt in the producer's mind as to the value of grading hogs, but there is occasionally some little difficulty in getting a price back to the producers commensurate with the quality of hog marketed.

This is being overcome, however, and today the compulsory grading, or marking for identification and grading on arrival at the yards is working well, and this combined with the producer's knowledge of market conditions is making for improvement in the quality of the bacon hogs marketed.

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That Car Of Yours

By WILLIAM ULLMAN. Hear-to-Hear Talks With Automobile Owners and Drivers on How to Get the Most Out of Their Cars at the Least Expense.

SIZE SHOULD BE EQUAL. Crowned roads, throwing an excessive part of the car's weight on the right wheels, always have been recognized as hard on the right tires.

There is a way to achieve exactly the same effect, regardless of the road, and many motorists are following it. In replacing a worn-out tire of the high pressure type—of which many millions still are used—one that is very much oversize often is added. The idea is good only if the new tire is of the same stature as the one with which it will work.

TOO MANY NAVIGATORS. That different eyes never see the same thing, even of like is particularly true of the maps used to guide the motoring party on its annual tour. That is the very best reason why, when the trip actually is under way, one person should be the navigator, in sole charge of keeping the car on its proper course. It may be the driver or it may be the person sitting beside him in the front seat. Certainly, it should not be the whole family.

LEARN GAUGE VAGARIES. The inexpensive gasoline gauge on the instrument board does not have to register accurately to justify its right to existence. That may not sound right but if the gauge is consistent in its inaccuracy, the motorist soon can learn its margin of error and be guided accordingly. For instance, no one need run out of gasoline because the tank is nearly dry. Fortunately, most of the gauges that are consistent in their mistakes.

CAN BE MADE AT HOME. One of the minor features of the latest cars that is winning a host of friends is the manner in which the electrical system is shielded from the effects of the driving Summer rain. It is seldom that one sees a stern because of wet lightning. The reason is that the distributor of his old car out of a discarded inner tube. It may not be so neat but it will work if carefully made.

LEARN FROM CAR AHEAD. The car immediately ahead, in the action of its visible motion, often seems to be trying to teach the driver some common sense. One that is most common is that revealed in the action of its wheels. If they are wobbling, it is more than funny. It means that the tires on the car are wearing fast because, in addition to the customary factors, they must absorb side to side play which grinds away the tread at a much more rapid rate.

BRAKE MORE THAN LINING. It is a strange thing that so many motorists should think of linings as being the whole of the braking system on their car. But, they do. Why not look upon the hook-up as including the rods, cables, pins, lock nuts, drums, equalizers, and the like? This, of course, applies to the mechanical brake's case. Such a view would lead to better care of the entire linkage and mean a big saving on the linings.

GET A PICTURE OF IT. Visualizing anything impresses it upon the mind. Take the manner of a lubricating vital engine units by a combination of pressure and splash systems. In such a case, the inside of the engine looks exactly as the world appears on a misty day. Not exactly either, for the oil mist generally is a bit heavier.
