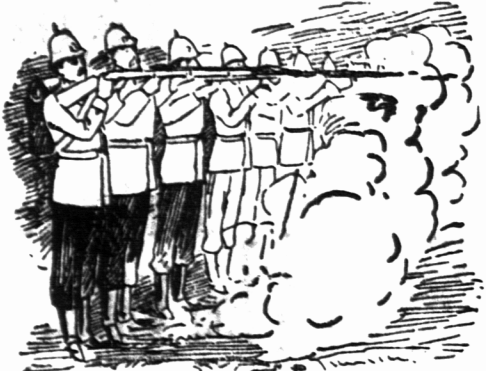

THE FEDERAL ELECTIONS.

A few months ago it was thought the Federal Government designed to have the elections brought on in the present month of June, and it was believed the Opposition were disposed to prolong the session so as to prevent the appeal to the people at this particular time. Be that as it may a June election this year is now out of the question, and hence many reached the conclusion that it might be brought on during the coming fall. This belief was somewhat strengthened by an article in the Toronto Globe a few weeks ago warning the faithful Liberals to be ready.

More recently another change has come over the outlook and it is now intimated that there will be no election this year at all, that there will be another and sixth session of the present Parliament, that before its close the Census will be taken and the Redistribution Bill passed, and thereafter the appeal to the country will be made. Whereupon the question arises whether there will be time for all these doings before the present Parliament will expire by limitation of law. It becomes therefore of some interest to learn precisely when the date of such expiration will occur, and also the date at which the official enumeration of the population by the Census shall take place.

The present Parliament was elected June 23, 1896. The Constitution provides that, "Every House of Commons shall continue for five years from the day of the return of the writs for choosing the House (subject to be sooner dissolved by the Governor General) and no longer." The writs for the election of 1896 were made returnable July 13, excepting those for Algoma, Nipissing, Gaspé, Chicoutimi and Saguenay which were some weeks later, carrying the actual time limit of the present House forward to August 1901. There will therefore be ample time for another session of Parliament should the Government so determine, but whether there would be time within such session for the passage of a Redistribution Bill after the Census taking is another and a different matter.

It will be remembered that during the present and the last previous session the Government made an effort to redistribute the Commons seats and that in both cases the Opposition contended that it was contrary to the spirit of the Constitution to make a general re-distribution except immediately after the taking of the decennial Census, and on this ground mainly the Senate assumed the responsibility of twice rejecting the Government Redistribution Bill. The Census of 1891, so far as the population was concerned, was taken on April 6. Allowing a full month for the compilation of the totals for Provinces

and Counties, there would still be nearly three months time within which to pass upon the question of Redistribution.

Probably the Commons would pass the Bill, however strongly the Opposition might resist it, within a month of its introduction, and the Senate would hardly venture a third time to reject the measure after the principal objection had been removed by the taking of the Census. So that it is within the bounds of possibility, certainly, and some may think it within the bounds of probability, that the Government may postpone the elections till 1901, with the hope of having the Redistribution Bill passed before the voting. It will not be wise, however to conclude that this will be the course of procedure, as the Government may hereafter decide upon making their appeal to the country this fall or in the early winter, for reasons of their own.

Trade continues to boom and the revenue will probably be well sustained for a year to come. These are conditions of which all Governments are observant in timing elections. But many things may occur within a few months to change the situation. Late reports from the Manitoba crop prospects are unfavorable. The experience of the Tupper Government in waiting till the last moment of the life of Parliament in 1896 was not an inspiring one, and there would be some will defined risks in following that example. Every one in that case would know just when the elections must be and the Government party would lose all chance of taking the Opposition by surprise, as they might do next fall or after next New Year's day. From the facts above cited each reader may form his own judgment as to the time when the elections are most likely to be called on.

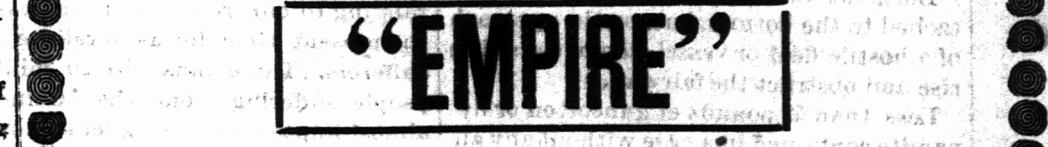
