## THE EDITOR'S MAIL, PERSONAL MENTION

**Prayers for the Dead.**

Sir,—The letter of "Plain Worshiper" from King's County called forth by the discussion of prayers for the dead in your journal shows a careful consideration of the matter by the writer, but reveals a lack of knowledge as to the actual teaching in St. Peter's Cathedral. The conclusion of the writer that the teaching of the High Church school is Catholic as opposed to Protestant is undoubtedly both logical and correct but he errs in stating that there is any concealment practised by those who hold these views. Might I suggest that Plain Worshiper purchase the booklet that contains a full report of the services in St. Peter's Cathedral on the occasion of the Queen's funeral and carefully consider the services and sermons therein contained.

After all, to what class does the Anglican Church, with its sister Churches, the Irish Church, the Scottish Episcopal Church, the Canadian Church, the South African Church, the Australian Church, the Protestant Episcopal Church, etc., etc, belong? The following is certainly one division possible.

**Class 1.** The Roman, Russian, Greek, Roumanian, Bulgarian, Armenian, Coptic, Swedish, Myggo, Old Catholic &c. Churches. Each of these claims a threefold ministry of Bishops, Priests and Deacons, who have been consecrated by preceding Bishops from the beginning of Christianity. Each claims and exercises the rite of confirmation as the final act of the admission to the sacraments of the Church. Each claims the right of her Bishops and Priests to pronounce absolution and each uses a ritual—but it is a written service and each with robed clergy, officiating in Churches the central object of which is the Altar, or Lord's Table.

**Class 2.** The Presbyterians, the Methodists, the Baptists, the Christians, the Universalists, the Unitarians, the Dutch Reformed, the Doppers, the United Brethren, Doukhoubers &c., who do not claim a threefold ministry in the Apostolic succession, who do not claim or exercise the rite of confirmation, whose clergy do not pronounce absolution, whose service is not in the main a ritual or written service, whose clergy do not as a rule wear special robes and the central object in the interior of whose churches is a pulpit.

Would "Plain Worshiper" be willing to apply the term "Catholic" to the first class of churches and the term "Protestant" to the second class, and if so would the Church of England and its sister church in Canada, fall under class 1 or class 2? In coming to a conclusion in the matter it would be well to remember that any individual who is a "confirmed" member of any of the Catholic churches is entitled to communicate in the English Church, whereas the members of the Protestant Churches are not entitled to take communion in the English Church unless they announced their intention of becoming confirmed.
