THE INTERCOLONIAL.

Hon. Mr. Blair has been able to announce that the business of the Intercolonial shows a large increase, and better still, gives a balance on the right side of the ledger since the extension to Montreal. In the ten months ended with April last the receipts were \$3,065,000 and the working expenses \$3,001,000, leaving a surplus of \$64,000.

It is too soon yet to reap the full benefit of the new and better western connection of the road, and a still further improvement in the Intercolonial balance sheet may yet be looked for. THE GUARDIAN always favored the extension, to which in fact both our great political parties have been committed, there difference in regard to it being as to the mode by which it was being effected. We do not understand that the Conservative leaders opposed the principle of extension, though the Toronto Globe at one time did so. And the Conservative party, in their turn opposed the Drummond Railway purchase.

No doubt the improved receipts of the Intercolonial are not wholly due to the fact of the road now running into Montreal. The enormous expansion of trade within the past few years is alone almost sufficient to account for the increased Intercolonial receipts. The improvement in general trade and industry, has, for instance, greatly increased the receipts of the Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk railways, as well as scores of the shorter lines in the Dominion.

Uncle Sam has been taking stock of the revenue producing qualities of the new islands that have come under his control. In the first four months of 1899 the customs revenue of Cuba was \$4,444,000; of the Philippines \$1,701,600 and of Porto Rico only \$481,128. This is disappointing, as the latter is the only island of which Uncle Sam has obtained full possession. He is still fighting the Filipinos and the fight is not over. He is only administering the affairs of Cuba as yet, but as it is the best revenue producer of them all, the period of administration, like that of Britain in Egypt, is likely to be prolonged.

Perhaps it was by an oversight that the Patriot, which has faithfully chronicled the number of "drunks" run in at the police station omitted to mention them yesterday, just as the new License Law was getting in its work.
