WANT ONE BAR TO EACH 200 PENRSOS

PARIS, Nov. 22.—(Special).—The Chamber of Deputies will begin Monday the discussion of the bill to limit the number of bars, saloons and other establishments for the sale of distilled spirits, which already has been passed by the Senate.

The measure places the number of bars at one for each two hundred inhabitants, and until this figure is reached no new bars may be opened. Mr. Jules Siegfried, a Deputy, once a Senator and once Minister of Commerce, in a report on the bill declares the consumption of alcohol has made appalling strides in the last half century and now averages five litres (5.3 quarts) of pure spirit for each head of the population which is equal to thirteen litres of the liquor of commerce.

There is one bar in France for every 82 inhabitants, as compared with one in 360 in the United States, one in 490 in England, one in 500 in Sweden and one in 9,000 in Norway. The effect of the bill will be gradually to reduce the number of bars in France from 480,000 to approximately 200,000.

AN IMPERIAL CONFERENCE FOR PRESSMEN.

TORONTO, Nov. 20.—The first business at the special meeting of the Canadian Press Association this morning was to amend the constitution by the incorporation of the Eastern and Western Canadian Press, thus making a national body of the association.

Then the case for holding an Imperial Press Conference in Canada was presented by Sir John Willison and supported by Mr. John A. Cooper of The Canadian Courier, and Mr. J. E. Atkinson of The Toronto Star.

On the motion of Mr. Atkinson it was decided to invite the journalists of Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa to Canada in 1914. A committee with Sir John Willison as chairman was appointed to make the necessary preparations. This afternoon the meeting was concerned chiefly with the report of Mr. M. E. Nichols, on postal rates for newspapers and periodicals.

BELIEVES HE HAS A LEPROSY CURE

OTTAWA, Nov. 20.—Dr. Montzambert, director of public health, believes that he has discovered a cure for leprosy. During the past year two of the cases which had been under the treatment at the Canadian leper colony at Tracadie, (N.B.), have been sent away cured. To all there has been four absolute cures.

The only doubt which is in Dr. Montzambert's mind is that the disease may have run itself out, for two cases have been cured in some way without more than ordinary care and treatment. At any rate four cases which have been completely cured and apparently hopeless cases have been materially benefited.

Forty years ago leprosy was first discovered in Canada, and there are now twenty-two lepers at the lazarette at Tracadie.

For nearly twenty years, Dr. Montzambert has made a special study of leprosy. He will explain his treatment shortly to medical bodies.

ICEBERGS HAVE APPEARED EARLIER THAN USUAL

NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—Icebergs have appeared in the lanes of west-bound Atlantic liners considerably earlier than usual. The captain of the Hamburg American line steamship Pennsylvania reported to the United States hydrographic office here yesterday by wireless that he had sighted three such bergs. The message was transmitted through the Cunard liner Laconia, bound for Boston. These bergs were in latitude 45.04 north and longitude 47.27 west, and were described as being 100 feet long and 30 feet high.

Another iceberg, 150 feet long, and 500 feet high, was sighted by the captain of the steamship Bristol City westbound from Bristol to New York in latitude 45.45 and longitude 48.00. It is unusual for ice to be so low at this time of the year, but the authorities do not regard the presence of the small icebergs as indicative of larger ones, and they are not considered dangerous to navigation.

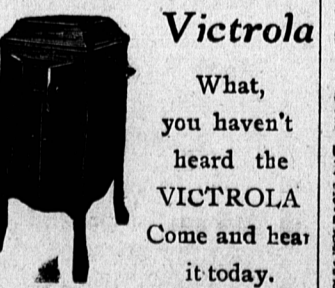

ENGLISH CRIME IS ON THE INCREASE

LONDON, Nov. 22.—(Special).—Opening the Manchester assizes Wednesday Mr. Justice Avey commented on the fact that the calendar contained sixty-eight cases, including four indictments for murder and two of manslaughter, and declared his intention of discouraging magistrates from sending to the assizes cases that could be dealt with at the quarter sessions. This is the second North of England assizes showing a heavy calendar, a judge in the city of Durham having recently commented on the increase of serious crime in that city.

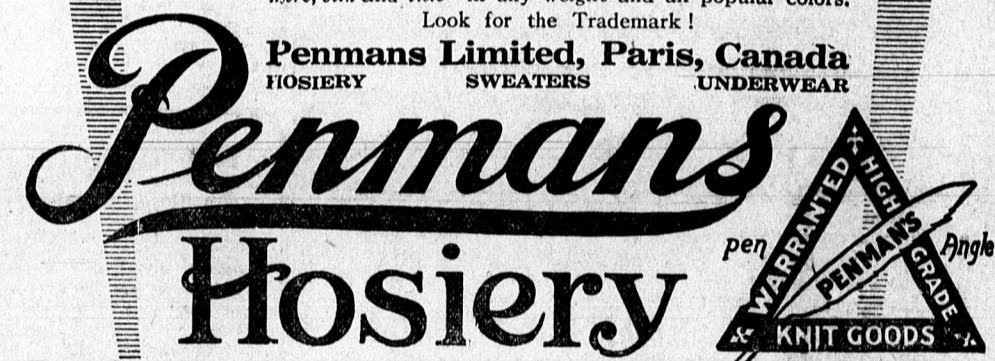

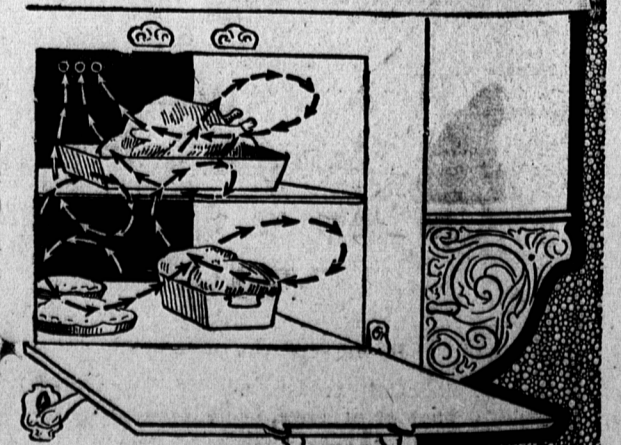
