PERPETUAL MOTION FAILURE CAUSED DOUBLE TRAGEDY.

LONDON, February 13—Perpetual motion has claimed another victim. At an inquest on the body of Hans Edgar Fries, who shot his wife and then himself on Saturday, the evidence showed that Fries had the "mania of invention" and had been trying to solve the problem of perpetual motion. Fries spent all his money in making a machine, which was a failure.

HAS BIG SCHEME FOR FEDERAL HIGHWAYS.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14—A system of federal highways consisting of trunk lines and branches will be suggested to Parliament when the good roads measure introduced by Hon. Frank Cochrane comes up for discussion. The federal roads scheme is to be advocated by Andrew Broder, of Dundas. Mr. Broder will propose, first of all, inter-provincial trunk lines. Then he would have north and south roads at intervals of, say, a score of miles, connecting these trunk lines with the local roads and settlements. The Dundas member believes that he can suggest a scheme of auto taxation which will help build the trunk lines.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14—Realizing the danger of Americans resident in Mexico from the circulation of erroneous press dispatches telling of proposed intervention on the part of the United States, the state department today issued another circular to its diplomatic and consular representatives in Mexico denying "all foolish stories" about American intervention, and expressing the good will and sincerest friendship of the United States government for Mexico.

During the Madero revolution the state department issued a similar circular. Since the present trouble assumed serious proportions the department has made every effort to stop the stories of intervention by making plain its policy toward the sister republic.

The American representatives in Mexico have been instructed to circulate the note in the local press and to use every means to get the denial of intervention before the populace.

In the note the sincerest friendship for Mexicans is expressed, with the hope that the blessings of peace will soon return to them.

Mexico's internal political affairs are not a point of concern to this government, according to the note, and the American government demands nothing but the respect and protection of American life and property.

The Mexican government has withdrawn its request to send Mexican federal soldiers through American territory from Eagle Pass to El Paso, Tex. It appears that some law has been brought to light, which prohibits the sending of troops out of Mexico, without permission of congress. Apparently this statute was unknown during the Madero revolution, or was ignored.

NEW ALLAN LINE SERVICE TO CANADA.

LONDON, Feb. 15—The Allan Line announces that it will inaugurate a steamship service between Plymouth and Canada within six weeks time, the first steamer to sail being the Sicilian on April 10. After May 17 there will be a fortnightly service to Quebec and Montreal.

FAITHFUL SERVANT WAS WELL REWARDED.

BOSTON, Mass., Feb. 15—For thirty years Mary Benson, an aged servant girl, worked faithfully for Miss Joan Rotch, a rich Milton, Mass., woman, and now she is rewarded by a gift of \$15,000, willed to her by her appreciative mistress. Miss Benson said in an interview: "I was born at St. John, and came here when young. I entered the employ of Miss Rotch as a maid and remained with her until her death. I was more of a companion than servant during her latter days and I knew that I would be remembered. During her sickness I acted as nurse. She was always kind to me and if I had been left nothing I should not have complained."

Miss Rotch gave away \$100,000 in her will.

NATIONAL TROTTERING ASSOCIATION MEETING.

NEW YORK, Feb. 15—With the election of officers and the authorizing of a new Southern racing district, the biennial congress of the National Trotting Association, ended yesterday. The changes in the rules effected included the adoption of a report of the rules committee providing that horses with records on mile tracks, shall be allowed three seconds when racing on half mile courses. Starters hereafter must report to the Association if there be any suppression or misrepresentation of the time taken in races. Failure to do so, will result in a starter being expelled. Despite a warm debate against the re-issuing of the rule prohibiting hobbles, it was decided by a vote of 295 to 61, that hobbles may be used in all classes except the two, three and four-year-olds. David Bonner of New York, and J. M. Johnson of Boston, were strong opponents to rescinding the rule prohibiting hobbles which has been in force two years.

YUKON COURT IS TO BE DONE AWAY WITH.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14—Owing to a diminishing amount of legal business it is understood that the Appeal Court of the Yukon Territory will shortly be abolished and Judges Dugas and Craig, who constitute it, superannuated. The act passed by the Government contained a proviso that one or both the judges could be retired when conditions were such as to warrant it.

WANT THE CANALS OPEN ON SUNDAY.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14—The canals of Canada should be open on Sundays for the passage of traffic, in the opinion of the Dominion Marine Association, and they told the government so, this morning, along with some other things. An early opening and later canal season was asked for, and the same reason was given as for Sunday operation, namely, that traffic was growing, the season was short, and though the Soo canal is now operated on Sunday, it could hardly keep up with the demands upon it.

Next spring there should be an effort to open the canals at the earliest possible date, to relieve the wheat congestion in the West. The association asked the government to put its foot upon any power projects which would in the slightest degree interfere with navigation in the St. Lawrence. Messrs. Cochrane, Monk and Hazen made the representations, and gave the usual assurance of consideration.

STEWART WAS THE VICTIM OF TREACHERY.

LONDON, Feb. 14—English feeling over the Stewart case is increased by this morning's disclosure in the German paper, the Hamburger Nachrichten, which has interviewed Rue, alias Arsene Verre, the Belgian criminal spy upon whose uncorroborated evidence Mr. Stewart was sentenced to three and a half years' imprisonment in a German fortress.

Rue admits that he betrayed Mr. Stewart for German gold. He says that while employed in Hamburg as representative of Courage & Company, London brewers, a London director of brewery asked him, in 1907, to collect information for the British War Office.

He came over to the War Office, he alleges and saw a major and lieutenant-colonel, and the latter engaged him as a spy at a yearly salary of \$1,250. He spent the next three years travelling in Germany, and sent several reports to the War Office, dealing mostly with general politics.
