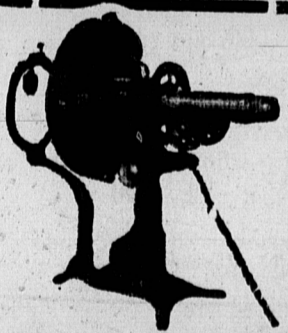

Bamford assisted by the Rev. F. W. Sawden, on January 4th. She was laid to rest beside her brother Verbal in St. John's Cemetery, Ellerslie. It is needless to sound her praises as she was highly esteemed by all who knew her. When a young girl she worked at R. T. Holman's in the millinery department and later went to Boston where she worked in a large millinery firm. A few years later she married and made her home in Vermont. She leaves to mourn besides a sorrowing husband and three children, her father, mother, two sisters Mrs. Frank P. Pope, Medford, Mass.; and Mrs. A. C. Williams, Bideford, P. E. I., and five brothers, Calvin R. at Inverness, B. C., Artemas R. at Castledale, B. C., Patterson at Mount Pleasant, P. E. I., Thomas and Peter at home. The pall bearers were Alfred England, Luther Williams, Claude Williams and Patterson McCaul.
