THE JAPANESE VICTORY.

Both the Russian and Japanese accounts confirm the report of the Japanese victory announced in our despatches of yesterday morning. It appears to have been a signal triumph for the Japanese arms, and it is doubly significant as being the first battle between considerable forces of Russians and Japanese on land. Added to the destruction wrought upon the Russian fleet by Admiral Togo it has greatly raised the prestige of the fighting forces of the Mikado.

of the Russian position on the north bank of the Yalu was conducted from the Korean side of the river, and as the Yalu is a very wide stream at least up to thirty miles from its mouth, the pontoon bridge on which the Japanese army crossed must have been a long one. Recent accounts showed the Japanese forces extended along the south-east bank of the Yalu for seventy miles with their largest body near Wiju.

The Russian account very frankly admits defeat. Their general staff account of the battle tells of a terrible bombardment across the river from 47 guns, the overwhelming superiority of the Japanese artillery and the heavy losses inflicted thereby. During the forenoon of April 30 and continuing till 5 o'clock in the afternoon the bombardment continued, rendering it "impossible" for the Russians longer to hold their fortified position at Turenchen. Thereupon the Japanese forces crossed the river, stormed the second Russian position on the heights near the village of Khussan and turned the Russian left flank.

The Japanese account agrees that the Russians were driven from two positions in succession, the second by a splendid infantry charge covering a front of four miles. The exact Russian force is not stated in total but consisted of the third division, two regiments of the sixth division, one cavalry brigade, 40 quick firing guns and eight machine guns. Generally speaking a division consists of two or more brigades and a brigade of two or more regiments. This was quite a formidable force, especially when well entrenched and with a river dividing it from the attacking army.

We are left to infer that the Russian defeat was turned into a rout, as the Czar's forces abandoned to the enemy 28 of the 40 quick-firing field guns which they carried into action, together with many stand of rifles and much ammunition. This is bad news for St. Petersburg, where it was strongly hoped that the disasters of the fleet would be speedily retrieved when the land forces became engaged. This hope is now dashed by a defeat on land, apparently as disastrous as the earlier reverses at sea.

The moral effect of the Russian defeat on the Yalu must be great and widespread, still further depressing the spirits of the Russian forces and proportionately raising the spirit and enthusiasm of the Japanese. It seems probable, however, that in the first land battle the Japanese were in considerably greater force than their enemy. But even if so, it shows good generalship to leave as little as possible to chance. So far the conduct of the war on the part of Japan appears to have been admirably prudent and free from mistake, every possible contingency being provided for.

THE BOXER AGAIN.

LONDON, April 29.—The Standard's Tien Tsin correspondent reports that a strong secret society movement, anti-Governmental and anti-foreign, is in progress in the vicinity of Tsin and Fu (175 miles south of Tien Tsin) and that the people are flocking to the cities for safety.

TOWN AND COUNTRY.

The Pioneer has been considerably impressed, and very properly so by Dr. Warburton's speech contrasting the proportion of direct taxation paid respectively by residents in the towns and country districts. Dr. Warburton's figures show that in 1903 Charlottetown and Summerside paid \$29,700 and the country \$73,073 out of a total of \$102,873, the towns paying at the rate of \$2 per head of population and the country districts 60 cents per head. We have seen so far no successful efforts to controvert the figures supplied by the representative of Charlottetown, and we need not further discuss them at the present time.

We are glad to find The Pioneer speaking favorably of the introduction of the municipal system, which The Guardian has long advocated as the best system of local self-government for any country. We also note The Pioneer's endorsement of the proposition repeatedly put forward in these columns, that the ferries ought to be made much more nearly self-sustaining than they have hitherto been. Some of these days when our last claim upon Ottawa has been recovered or finally rejected the Province ought to adopt the municipal system, readjust its plans for the support of education and devise a more equitable system for the distribution of such taxation as may then be necessary.
