

Premier Makes Budget Speech

Following is the conclusion of the report of the Budget speech delivered by Premier Campbell in the Legislature on Saturday morning.

Among the other estimated expenditure items the Premier mentioned \$12,000, subscriptions to limestone.

For special war expenditures there is \$24,100 against which there is an estimated contribution of \$4,500.

Expenditures are intended for construction or reconstruction of highways, maintenance of traffic to airports and other military centres, administration of air raid precautions and care of evacuated children.
