SCENE ON AUSTRALIAN LINER

DON, July 26.—A party of propagandists aboard the Australian liner Ormonde, which arrived Plymouth yesterday, received sight of their lives in the Indian Ocean.
They were travelling steerage and preaching revolution, to the disgust of other passengers in particular. The agitators hoped to create dissatisfaction among the ranks of the British.
It was determined to teach the agitators a lesson, so a few days after leaving Colombo one of the agitators began to sing 'God Save the King' in a moment hundreds joined in, and men, women and children rose to their feet. The agitators alone remained seated and kept their hats on.
Immediately trouble began. The Reds were asked to sing the national anthem. They refused. There was a rush toward them. Bottles and other handy missiles were thrown at them and there were yells to throw them overboard.
The ship's officers heard the disturbance and interfered just in time. They forced their way through the crowd of angry passengers and closed around the agitators. They carried them off to another part of the ship and kept them safe there for several days until the trouble had blown over.

PREMIERS TOO BUSY TO RECEIVE FREEDOM OF BATH

LONDON, July 27.—Premier Meighen and the other dominion premiers, who have been attending the imperial conference, were to have received the freedom of the city of Bath on Sunday, but as the Canadian premier and General Smuts had a number of conferences set for that day they were therefore unable to fill their engagement.

SAPPHIRE IN NOSE—A NEW FASHION.

WASHINGTON, July 25.—The President received Princess Fatima Sultana of Khabul, sister of the Sultan of Afghanistan, this afternoon in the Blue Room of the White House. She was accompanied by the Crown Prince of Egypt and her two sons. The Princess wore the costume of her own country, in pale pink and gold brocade. The garment, made on straight lines, reached to the knee, and was trimmed with bands of gold braid. She wore hunter's green silk hose with low quartered patent leather shoes. On her head she wore a scarf of tissue to match the hose, edged with gold lace and held about her forehead with a gold band and a small ostrich feather. The scarf fell in points and almost to the ground. Numberless gold bangles were hung about her neck, and embedded in the right side of her nose was a sparkling blue sapphire.

WARSHIPS HELPING SPANISH FORCES

MADRID, July 26.—The Minister of War has issued an official note saying that advice received up to Monday morning showed that Melilla was quiet.
Troops have been landed. About one-third of them are European. They were given an enthusiastic reception. The Spanish battleship Princess de Asturias is lying off the coast.
Information has been received that five captains, two lieutenants and forty-four soldiers are held captives by the Moors. The prisoners are being well treated.
Private advices from Melilla says the situation is not improving. Advanced positions are being abandoned by the Spaniards and the troops concentrated on the extreme line of defense.

FOODSTUFFS IN RUSSIA AT FANTASTIC PRICES
BERLIN, July 27.—Fantastic prices for necessities of life are reported in recent advices from Petrograd and Moscow. Some late price quotations are: A pound of bread, 4,500 rubles (the normal pre-war value of the ruble was about five cents); a pound of butter, 20,000 rubles; a pound of sugar, 20,000 rubles; a pound of potatoes, 2,000 rubles; three fourth of a litre of milk, (about 1-1/2 pints) 2,500; ten eggs, 13,000 to 15,000; a second hand suit of clothes, 260,000 to 300,000; a new suit, 500,000 to 1,000,000; a pair of shoes, 300,000.
