BURLINGTON W. A.

The members of the W. A. of St. Stephen's Church, Burlington, met at the home of Mrs. James Evans in February and had the rare privilege of listening to first-hand information on work among Indians in Western Canada. Mrs. Alec Lockhart was the guest speaker and was introduced by the president, Mrs. W. J. Harrington, as a woman who, if not actually an Anglican, had been organist in an Anglican church for fifteen years. Mrs. Lockhart said that her husband had accepted a position with the Indian Department in Saskatchewan in 1929 and that she, by accident, had learned that the department was anxious to organize a Homemakers' Club on the reserve, which supported between 600 and 700 Indians. Having had some experience she offered her services, and was accepted. The women, who, she said, had their own Women's Auxiliary, and were very interested in the church, which they always kept very clean, were glad to join a Homemakers' Club. Assisted by the school teacher, Mrs. Lockhart gave cooking demonstrations and the women and girls were apt pupils. They also taught gardening. She said: "The women had no idea of gardening, but even the first year was very successful, and one of the mothers remarked on the absence of sores on the children, when the diet contained vegetables." The Lockharts were later transferred to Onion Lake Reserve, and there, too, a Homemakers' Club was organized. There they built a club house, with some assistance from the department. The women learned rug making, quilt making, dressmaking, and took up "canning" in a big way, when 672 quarts of fruits and vegetables were put away for winter use. Mrs. Lockhart said that "the Indian women are clever with the needle, and were able to carry away 23 prizes at the Regina Fair." The Indian women now carry on the work by themselves, which is very encouraging. The sales sent by W. A. members are very helpful and the articles and his wife. The speaker explained that christianizing the Indians will take a great deal of time, as they do not always understand, and get strange ideas about religious rites. The president thanked the speaker, and other members expressed appreciation of her very interesting talk. The World Day of Prayer, to be held at the home of Mrs. Ellis Profit, was discussed briefly. A donation of prints from Eatons was displayed and a quilt is to be made for the sale. Some money was paid in for the sale, and it was suggested that all members pay as soon as possible, so that the

outfit may be bought as opportunity offers. Mrs. W. J. Harrington, Mrs. A. H. Campbell, Mrs. J. Weeks Murphy and others were appointed to attend the next meeting of the vestry, as requested, and it was suggested that all women interested in the re-decorating of the church, should attend the meeting if possible. Several members took part in the program. A delicious lunch was served by the hostess. —Bur.
