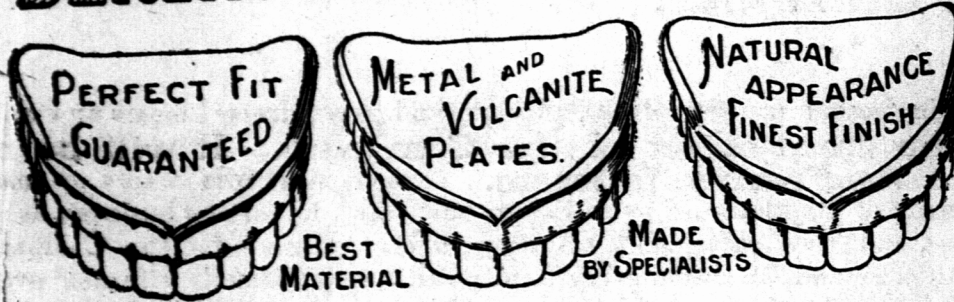

S. S. LESSON.

MAY 5.
JESUS AND PETER.
 John 21. 15-22. Memory verses, 15:17
GOLDEN TEXT
 Lovest thou me?—John 21. 17.

OUTLINE.

1. "Lovest thou me?" v. 15-17.
 2. "Follow me," v. 18-22.
 Time.—Late in April or early in May.
 A. D. 30: A few days after the resurrection.

Place.—The Sea of Galilee.
 LESSON HELPS.

15. "So when they had dined"—The scene of this lesson is on the Lake of Tiberias. Jesus had drawn near the disciples and asked them if they had any food. They knew him not, but when he told them to cast the net on the right side of the ship, and they did so, and it was so full that they were scarce able to draw it, they began to find out that the person was indeed Jesus. "Simon, son of Jonas"—He is not now called Peter, which was the name of honor Jesus had once given, or at the denial he did not show his wonted firmness of character. "Lovest"—In the sense of prize. Doest thou love me with an appreciating love? "More than these"—That is, more than these other disciples love me. "Thou knowest that I love thee"—The reply of Peter is prompt and ardent with affection. "Feed my lambs"—He is given work to do which can only be properly done by one who loves the great Shepherd.

16. "The second time."—The question asked the second time to make it emphatic to remind him of duty once forgotten. "Yea, Lord"—The answer is repeated. "Feed my sheep"—The word feed rather should be shepherd, for it includes the whole of the shepherd's office. 17. "He saith unto him the third time"—Thrice had Peter denied his Lord, and thrice, therefore, was this question asked. The question thrice repeated grieved Peter, for he feared it implied a doubt on the subject. "Thou knowest all things"—A beautiful reply, appearing as it did to the knowledge of Jesus and being assured that the fact would be made clear beyond doubt or the need of further questioning.

18. "Thou shalt stretch forth thy hands"—A comparison between his youth and age. In youth he could tighten his girdle when severe work was to be undertaken but in age another would have to do it for him. Another would have to lead him. Carry thee whither thou wouldst not"—He would be carried to the grave. There is a dim allusion to the death of Peter, and the taking and binding of him to the cross.

19. "Follow me"—This is a command to every disciple, not in its literal but figurative and more important sense. We follow Jesus when we hold the truth as he did and carry it out in our lives as he did. We are to follow Jesus in doing good to others.

20. "The disciple whom Jesus loved"—which was John: who wrote the gospel which bears his name and other parts of the New Testament. He had deep affection for Christ, and tradition says he lived to an extreme old age.

21. "If I will"—Our Lord here shows that he is the man of destiny. Nothing can take place without his permission. "That he tarri"—That he lives upon the earth. "What is that to thee"—A very proper question. There was work for Peter to do, and he ought to do it whether John did his work or not. Each person has individual responsibility and must not measure his work by the pattern of others.
