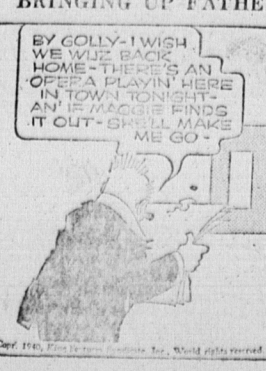

Application Of New Taxes To Individuals

Following is the text of Finance Minister Balston's budget speech in the House of Commons, June 24, continued from yesterday's Guardian: Coming now to the second revenue measure applicable to individuals: to supplement the graduated income tax we propose a national defence tax at a flat rate applicable to all incomes above \$600 for single persons and above \$1,200 for married persons...

As far as it is administratively practicable this tax will be collected at the source. Thus employers will deduct the tax from the employee's earnings when the pay is made at the rate of \$600 per year in the case of unmarried employees and \$1,200 per year in the case of married employees...

Smokers' Supplies Smokers' supplies are again made the subject of tax increases. It is proposed that the excise tax on matches shall be increased from three-quarters of a cent to one cent per 100...

Auto Taxes It is proposed that the present excise tax on automobile tires and tubes shall be increased from three cents and three cents per pound respectively to five cents and five cents per pound...
