HISTORIC P. E. I. CEMETERY AND ITS MONUMENTS

Detailed Review and List of Stones and Inscriptions in old Protestant Cemetery of Interest To Islanders at Home and Abroad.

Summary of the condition of the monuments in the old Protestant Cemetery, Elm Avenue, Charlottetown, except those that have been cleared of weeds, etc. Four others need slight repairs only, and of these 4 arrangements are already in hand to care for 2. One other, in perfect condition except that it has settled, but that all parts are probably intact. This is being cared for privately. The remaining 3 of the 11 are in a state of complete collapse, but a preliminary inspection indicates that all parts are probably intact and that it is quite feasible to put these three fine sarcophagi together again. Certainly they should not be left to lie in unseeing decay. At present, photographs of two of the collapsed tombs accompany this report. There is no reason to think the rebuilding of these three sarcophagi at not too great expense, but that all parts are probably intact in the event this cannot be done in one or more cases, then the only remaining solution would be to take the fine top stones, which are intact, and lay them flat on the ground, removing the unneeded stones. However, such a drastic solution of this problem would seem a last resort. As time goes on these relics of the past will become more and more valuable for their antiquarian interest, if for no other.

Reference has already been made to the excellent conditions of many of the oldest stones in the cemetery. This is the all too apparent evidence of careless repair work. Stones that could have been nearly repaired at small expense have been rudely daubed with cement and stuck together in such a untidy and unlovely manner that any sensitive observer would probably prefer to see stones lying flat than subjected to such an indignity. In quite a number of cases where slabs mounted on bases were broken at the foot, the uneven, jagged ends have been re-cemented to the bases. In almost all such cases no portion of the inscriptions would have been lost if the foot of the stones had been cut and made square. Two photographs of the six accompanying this report illustrate the unhappy condition at present found. In all 31 slabs have been classified as "badly cemented." In at least 10 of the 31 cases, recutting of the foot of the stones is indicated. From an estimate given by a leading stone mason, it is believed that slabs could be recut at the foot and re-cemented on their bases for \$2.00 each, or possibly for less, if all were done at the same time on contract. Naturally, great care would have to be taken to see that the right slabs were cut on the right bases. Some of the 31 slabs classified as "badly cemented" could be greatly improved in appearance with very little intelligent effort—I refer here to cases not involving the recutting of the stones.

Fifty-one slabs have been listed as in need of raising, and two as needing to be lowered. If this work is undertaken, bases will have to be supplied in some cases, in others not. These 53 slabs are in good condition (with the exception of faded lettering in some cases) otherwise.

In the final class—numbering 64—are broken slabs, portions of slabs and slabs needing miscellaneous repairs. In many of these cases very small expenditure would result in a perfectly respectable marker.

Monument Shafts Of the 34 monument shafts in the cemetery 24 are in need of levelling. From the purely physical standpoint the need for levelling these shafts is the most urgent of any. Some shafts, already fallen and mended (sometimes very crudely) once, are in imminent danger of falling again. Others, still intact, are tipping badly. A part from damage to expensiveness and often handsome and beautiful monuments, the sight of these tall shafts pointing towards the sky at unseemly angles seems to the visitor a conspicuous and painful evidence of neglect.

Where there is a will there is a way—almost always. Admittedly, to engage a stone mason to do this work on a strictly business basis would cost a good deal. As far as the writer's knowledge goes, there is no dependable, lasting way of keeping monuments erect short of giving each a cement base which goes below the frost line—in Prince Edward Island, that is, a half feet. Moving of heavy monuments by the proper equipment would be required, the removal of earth, the building of wooden forms (presumably) for the cement, the procuring of cement and sand, the mixing and pouring of the cement, and the resetting of the monuments, after any needed repairs. This seems formidable, when 24 monuments are involved. But would not some descendants, at least, be interested? And are there not in Charlottetown public spirited men who would contribute their labor and skill and also materials at cost, if not by outright gift? Could not such men be found? At least, it would do no harm to try to find them. In trying to enlist the interests of descendants there is some encouraging evidence: several shafts in this cemetery have obviously been repaired privately, and in one case, at my rate, releveling has been done—as late as 1930, for it is so stated on the shaft.

Sarcophagi The 11 sarcophagi found in this cemetery have much interest. They are antiques in stone, and several of them are very beautiful. All are worth inspection. Fortunately, the putting of them all in good condition does not seem formidable. Of the 11, 2 are now in satisfactory condition, except that their bases should be cleared of weeds, etc. Four others need slight repairs only, and of these 4 arrangements are already in hand to care for 2. One other, in perfect condition except that it has settled, but that all parts are probably intact. This is being cared for privately. The remaining 3 of the 11 are in a state of complete collapse, but a preliminary inspection indicates that all parts are probably intact and that it is quite feasible to put these three fine sarcophagi together again. Certainly they should not be left to lie in unseeing decay. At present, photographs of two of the collapsed tombs accompany this report. There is no reason to think the rebuilding of these three sarcophagi at not too great expense, but that all parts are probably intact in the event this cannot be done in one or more cases, then the only remaining solution would be to take the fine top stones, which are intact, and lay them flat on the ground, removing the unneeded stones.
