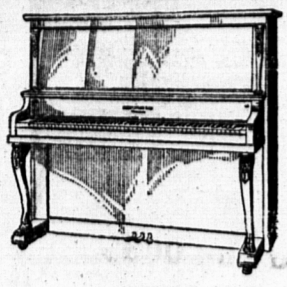

Dr. Norwood Claims He Was Misreported

LONDON, Sept. 22.—Preaching in the City Temple this evening, Dr. Charles Williams referred to an address given in Toronto last Thursday by Dr. F. W. Norwood of this city, in which the noted British preacher was reported to have said that during the Great War the British forces slaughtered more women and children by air raids on defenceless towns than did the Germans. Dr. Williams read two cablegrams received from Toronto today, the first one from organizing secretary of Dr. Norwood's Canadian tour, declaring that Dr. Norwood did not say what "sensational headlines" reported. "His utterances were of the noblest order and he promoted loyalty to the Motherland as few others could have done. He has the gratitude and love of many thousands of true loyal Canadians whom by his fearless and righteous patriotism, he has bound closer to the Homeland. But you who know him, know he needs no defence," the secretary's communication read.

The second cablegram, sent by the resident minister of the Toronto church in which Dr. Norwood spoke Thursday, said "Indignantly repudiate misrepresentation of Dr. Norwood's speech here. Word 'rotten' never passed Norwood's lips. His only reference was sorrowful admission that British inescapably compelled poison gas and bombing towns in military retaliation. He expressly charged Germany with initial responsibility."

The address by Dr. Norwood which has caused such a stir was delivered at a Peace Meeting held in Sherbourne Street United Church on Thursday, September 16. His words respecting the use of poison gas and bombing of defenceless towns by the British caused a tense feeling, and Dr. Norwood was challenged to make good his assertions. In the report in The Mail and Empire it was stated:
