### THE PANAMA CANAL.

All the world is interested in the Panama Canal which the United States has undertaken to build, and which is likely to prove a much more costly undertaking than our American friends thought when they became committed to it. But the wealth of the Republic and its resources in the way of skilled engineers and the best mechanical labor-saving appliances are so great that we may rest assured the great work will be completed in due time even if there be some impatience to see the "dirt begin to fly" before everything is ready.

The getting ready for a work of such colossal proportions is no small task. Among the first things to be decided is whether the canal shall be at sea level throughout, or carried by locks over the backbone of the isthmus. The other day the canal Commissioners decided in favor of a sea-level canal, although it may cost \$100,000,000 more than one or more of the plans in which locks are introduced. This report awaits the confirmation of Congress, but the report of the able engineers and experts who constitute the Commission will have great weight with Congress and the country. It is felt on all hands that apart from the question of

cost a channel at the level of the sea is much preferable to a canal with locks. Once constructed, the cost of operating and maintaining the sea-level canal would be much less than in the case of a canal with locks.

One of the worst effects of an exodus upon a community is caused by the fact that it is the young, healthy and enterprising who leave us, while the aged, the sick, the cripples, the insane and helpless are left behind. Thus the quality of the entire population is deteriorated, production is diminished; the death rate is increased and a variety of ills too numerous to mention results. We need the Tunnel to equalize conditions of living, to enable us to carry on manufactures, giving employment throughout the year and to stop the deplorable exodus which is still going on.

As to the general tenor of the evidence so far submitted to the Tariff Commission a very good guess could have been made beforehand. The manufacturers with few exceptions desire a high tariff. The farmers with no exceptions desire to have the tariff left as it is or lowered. But the astute Ministers know that the manufacturers represent a compact and formidable fighting force, well armed with the sinews of war. The farmers, on the other hand, without any distinctive organization for their own protection, and divided as they are by Conservative and Liberal party ties, are about as powerless in a political fight as two flocks of sheep. The manufacturers always win in these contests and the farmers meekly take on the new burdens.

## EULOGY OF LATE FRANCIS BAIN

The Speech of His Honor Lieut. Governor McKinnon at Unveiling Saturday.

The following is the speech of Lieutenant Governor McKinnon at the unveiling of the Bain Monument on Saturday. President Watson of the Historical Society closed his remarks stating that he had not the gift of eloquence while he showed that he had by his eloquent address. I am no orator as Watson is, but as you know me all a plain, blunt man that loves my friend. I remember well attending the early meetings of this society when Francis Bain excelled as a speaker on geological matters while the late Dr. Leeming and Charles Palmer had also specialties such as Primeval Man, etc.

We are met today to unveil this monument to Francis Bain. He died eleven years ago. He had been a farmer but devoted his spare hours to study—chiefly to nature studies. He is counted the first and greatest naturalist this Island has produced. His geological researches have thrown new light on the structure of his native Island Meeting with the approval of Dr. Ellis and with the approval of the view of Sir William Dawson the latter concluded finally that Bain's views were correct. His views were presented before the Royal Society of Canada and won general commendation. His expression in his work is choice literature. He loved his native land, its birds and plants and even its very stones to him were dear.

Our boys and girls we hope will be inspired the more they know of their native land to love it more, for how can they love another land so well. There is need for more patriotism and more knowledge of our own land and its resources. This monument although not pretensions is of granite from our own country and is lasting. His memory will live. His example will encourage others to further effort along scientific lines.

It is a tribute from his fellow-members of the Natural History and Antiquarian Society who knew his many virtues. Public monuments have been erected to statesmen, warriors and poets and it is creditable to the farmers of Prince Edward Island that the second monument to find a place in the Public Square of this city, with the good will and common consent of our citizens is erected to one of their number.

The Province is still comparatively young in its history but when it has produced such honored men as it has, it makes us hopeful of the good time coming and hopeful too of our coming men. I now unveil this monument.

After His Worship the Mayor had taken over the monument on behalf of the city in a happy speech two excellent addresses were given by John McSwain and John Newson, co-workers of Mr. Bain.

The monument consists of a large granite boulder resting on a slab of grey sandstone and having on one side a handsome bronze tablet bearing this inscription.

Francis Bain. Naturalist. 1842-1904.

Erected by the Natural History and Antiquarian Society of Prince Edward Island.

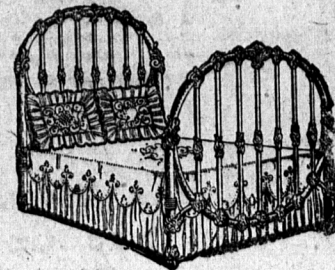

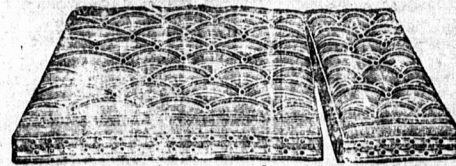
