CLOSING STOCK LETTER

NEW YORK, Jan. 10—Canada's Pacific was a feature of the market this morning advancing 4 1/2 points on the start on the increase in the dividend and supplementing this with further rise of three points more.

There was little pressure of stock however, and trading remained dull and professional during the morning hours. In the afternoon some of the specialties began to turn weak.

Amongst them being conspicuous corn products, Central Leather and Best Sugar. On Corn products and Best Sugar there was no news but the leather business was pronounced extremely bad and it was said that the declines were generally gradual.

The weakness in these stocks gradually extended to the standard issues and on a moderate amount of selling for both accounts these issues sold off quite easily, so that fair sized orders on the day's trading. It was announced that Mr. Morgan, who was to sail tomorrow, had postponed his departure and, of course, this gave rise to a good deal of gossip as it was thought that the banking situation was such as to require his presence here for some longer.

GRAIN LETTER

CHICAGO, Jan. 10—The wheat market opened steady, but declined after an hour of trading by one of the leading firms. However, after this time was disposed of the market advanced on fair commission.

Corn has been very active and strong, cable advices from Argentine on thirty various sources claim serious damage to the growing crop there. One cable states that three quarters of the crop is destroyed. Foreigners again fair buyers.

Oats have been extremely dull and featureless following grain. Provisions have been easier, cash trade poor.

CLOSING COTTON LETTER. NEW YORK, Jan. 10—The census of 22 bales of cotton to January 1st fell a little under expectations based on the rumored report of the National Ginners' Association and in connection with a very firm set of cables started covering by recent sellers.

But neither the Liverpool news nor the gaining figures served to stimulate outside demand and after showing a net advance of about 15 to 20 the market reacted from the best under realizing, part of which has attributed to leading bulls. As is generally the case when long cotton seems to be coming on the market, the absence of support from strong sources, local bears became sellers on the decline, but while more or less nervous and unsettled the market failed to show actual weakness after easing off to about 15.05 for May.

Ginning from Jan'y 1st to the end of the season must not exceed 340,000 bales to bring the total within the Government's estimate of 11,420,000 while after January 1st last year 425,000 bales were ginned. In view of the fact that 95.3 per cent. of the total was ginned to January 1st last year and 93 per cent. to January 1st, 1908, when the crop was over 13,700,000 it would seem fairly conservative to assume that the ginning to January 1st this year represents approximately 96 per cent. of the total for the season. It would figure out about 11,500,000 bales. Allowing 350,000 bales for lint, and this view would suggest a commercial drop of a little under twelve million bales. Such a crop does not mean as marked a deficiency in the supply as considered likely earlier in the season but it does mean that that there is little chance of entering the new season with anything more in the shape of a reserve. Moreover this crop has been marketed so far and has been taken by the mills at such high prices that the basis for a bull movement is quite evident, particularly should the planting season prove anything short of satisfactory.
