Their business is to grouch and growl, and they will do so while there is a kick of life in the dying embers of their party.

But our twisty friend says this is to be followed by an increase in the sales tax and is "to be transferred to the shoulders of the consumer." And who says this, the Government or the Grit press of which the Patriot is a sample? If it were so isn't it just what this press has been clamouring for? Can anything satisfy them? Have n't merchants all over Canada Boards of Trade and mercantile associations asked for it? Then who paid the Luxury Tax but the "consumer," and if it is transferred to the Sales Tax, will it not still be applied to luxuries as before, and not to the poor man's good as the evening romancer would lead its readers to believe. But in stern solid fact IT IS NOW REMOVED AND HAS NOT BEEN PLACED ON THE SALES OR ANY OTHER TAX, AND WHEN IT IS IT WILL BE TIME ENOUGH FOR THE PATRIOT TO DO ITS CROAKING.

The immediate reason for removing the tax was to benefit the working man. As the natural sequence of falling prices and trade reaction there is a depression in business, a tying up of industrial institutions and extensive unemployment throughout Canada. Wealthy men have money which if put into circulation will make conditions easier for the people. By removing the Luxury Tax and inducing a more liberal purchase of such articles by those who can afford it, it will tend to stimulate trade, increasing the demand for these articles and providing employment in the manufacture of this class of goods. The measure is to encourage the rich man to more liberal purchases, to shell out, so that work may be given to the idle, and the poor man may reap the benefit.

Then it gets off a characteristic whine over what it describes as "odious, outrageous favouritism." Imagine for a moment the Patriot or the Bell Government, or any one connected with the miserable combination talking "FAVOURITISM," outrageous, or of any other kind. With the whole country in a state of boiling indignation, and meetings being held in every part of the province in de-
