## In Memoriam

### MRS. JOHN McISAAC

In the passing away of Mrs. John McIsaac on the morning of Tuesday, October 11th at the advanced age of 84 years the community of Wood Islands lost not only one of its oldest but also one of its most highly respected residents. The deceased had been in a condition of failing health for upwards of a year so that the coming of the end was not unexpected. In November last she was taken quite suddenly ill and it was at first believed that it would not be long before she would be restored to her usual quite good condition of health again. But as time wore on it became more and more evident to her loved ones that instead of improving, her whole physical constitution was gradually breaking down. Being possessed of the faculty of always seeing the brighter side of things she kept looking forward

with hope to the day when she would be able to be up and around again and although at times she suffered severe pain she always remained contented and cheerful through it all. All that medical skill and kind friends could do was done throughout her long illness. She was tenderly cared for by her daughter, Mrs. Hugh McKinnon, assisted by another daughter, Mrs. Angus Smith, Hopfield. But it was all of little avail, her supply of reserve energy gradually decreased until on the above mentioned date her gentle spirit winged its heavenward flight. Mrs. McIsaac was twice married. Her first husband, Mr. Donald Gillis died in 1896 and her second husband Mr. John McIsaac passed away in 1916. The deceased now leaves to mourn the loss of a kind and loving mother four daughters, namely, Mrs. John L. Murray, Lexington, Mass.; Mrs. Oran Steeves, Campbellton, N.B.; Mrs. Angus Smith Hopfield and Mrs. Hugh McKinnon, Wood Islands. Their mother was very dear to all of her daughters and all are

feeling their loss very keenly. Mrs. McIsaac was one of a family of twelve members in all, four full brothers, two half brothers and six sisters. The deceased was the last surviving member, all of the others having passed away at different periods during the past forty years. Mrs. McIsaac was a lady who was very favorably known throughout the whole countryside. All ages and all classes found in her a friend. To her house all worthy comers received a hearty welcome and no one in search of help ever called upon her in vain. In times of sickness and sorrow she was a real mother in Israel to all who were in need. But such sighing and longing will be in vain. She has gone on forever into that land where sorrow and suffering and pain are unknown and where too, we doubt not, she has already received the Master's welcome plaudits. "Well done good and faithful servant, enter thou forever into the joy of thy Lord." As the end drew near she remained calm and unmoved; "knew in whom she had believed and she was persuaded that He was able to keep what she had committed to His trust against that day." For her there was no dark valley. She felt sure that that Saviour who throughout life had been her strength and comfort would not forsake her in "the Swellings of Jordan", but would lead her safely through and welcome her into that home of many mansions of which she often spoke, and for the reaching of which she often longed. Her passing was one of sweet peace. The funeral which was a large one was held on the afternoon of Thursday, October 13th. In the unavoidable absence of her minister, Rev. R. Hensley Stavert, the service was conducted by Rev. T. Owen Hughes, assisted by Rev. H. Flannigan. Three favorite hymns of the deceased were sung, viz., "Safe in the Arms of Jesus", "Rock of Ages" and "Asleep in Jesus." A duet, "Softly and Tenderly" was very beautifully rendered by Messrs. Cameron MacPhee and David Ross. The service throughout was a very impressive one. The floral tributes were many and beautiful and consisted of the following:

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)—The impending retirement of Attorney-General Homer Cummings is the first change in President Roosevelt's cabinet circle, except for vacancies caused by death, since the new deal came into power in 1933.

Because of the frequency with which Cummings' desire to step out of public life and resume his private law business has been rumored for years, his retirement in the wake of the first election set-back for the administration takes on little significance, in the view of most observers. In the new deal official and administrative family, even younger figures than Cummings have at times pondered retirement to seek better earning opportunities than government service affords. Among

them—back in 1936—was Harry Hopkins, director of the works progress administration, now rumored slated for elevation to the cabinet. For three reasons, efforts at attaching any special significance to Cummings' retirement aside from his own personal affairs fail to be convincing. Something approaching a Roosevelt post-election plan of campaign may be indicated in the nomination of Cummings' successor or in other

new cabinet selections which may soon appear. The only name widely mentioned for Attorney General is that of Solicitor General Robert Jackson, just as Hopkins alone is named in connection with reports that Commerce Secretary Roper soon will vacate the Commerce Post. (These reports persisted, despite Roper's assertion at a press conference today that he did not intend to resign.)



Awe-inspiring in its bulk is this newest weapon of the U. S. Army Air Corps, the four-motored B. 15, which took part in maneuvers at Fort Bragg, N.C. It is said to be the largest military makes the claim easily credible. The two soldiers in the lower right are pigmy figures in the shadow of the huge machine, the automobiles in the centre and left background look like toys.

The cage in the nose of the fuselage is fitted as a gunner's post, affording an unobstructed view. A similar post is built into the under side of the fuselage, a short distance forward of the landing wheels.

Immense as this plane is, a bigger one is said to be on the way, a 75-ton craft that will make the term "flying battleship" seem less imaginary.
