**THE DUKE OF MARLBOROUGH'S DAUGHTER.**

Making a Two Hundred Mile Ride With Her Maid in South Africa.

When she was last heard of, Lady Sarah Wilson, a cut of whom appears in this issue, accompanied by her maid, was riding from Mefeking on a two hundred mile journey. Her husband, Captain Gordon Chesney Wilson, of the Royal Horse Guards, is of the gallant little band of officers aiding Colonel Baden-Powell in keeping the Boer Com-

mandant, Cronje, at bay. Lady Sarah was not long in following her husband out to South Africa. The youngest of the large family of the seventh Duke of Marlborough—there were five sons and six daughters—she had won a reputation among her friends for inheriting more than her share of the martial qualities of her great ancestor, the famous Churchill of Blenheim, even before the present war gave so favorable an opportunity for display.

The first Duchess, the imperious favorite of Queen Ann, seems to reappear in her youngest namesake. She is aunt of the present duke, and sister of the late Lord Randolph Churchill. All her sisters are pretty and clever women, and figure largely in English society. One is the Duchess of Roxburghe, another Lady winborne, Lady Tweedmouth's salon is a meeting-place for the politicians of the Rosebery circle, while Lady de Ramsey, and Lady Georgina Curzon have each achieved her own social success.

Lady Sarah Wilson appears, like another Di Vernon, eager to face any hazards, so that she may carry tidings of the welfare of the beleaguered garrison and, if need be, summon a flying column to its aid.
