FORTUNE ROAD W. I.

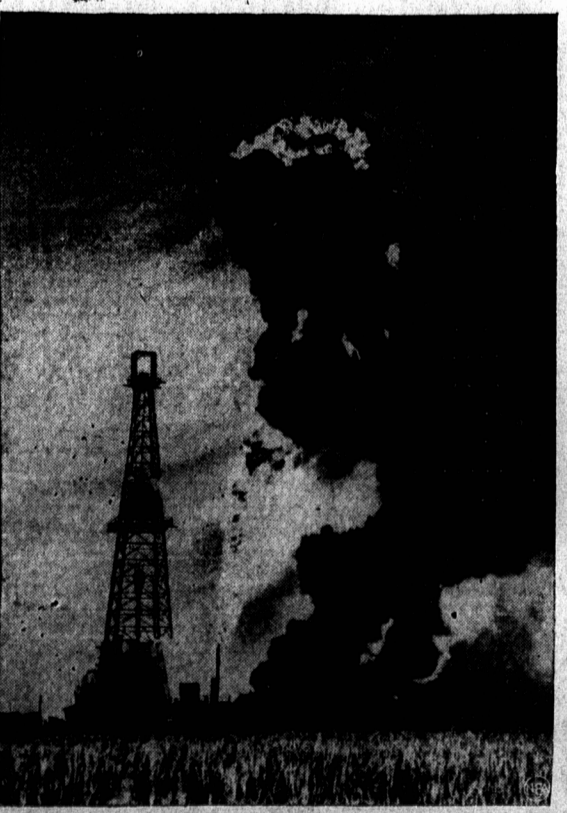
