**OCEAN'S MANY MICROBES.**  
 Fatal Results of Bacterium in Sea Life—  
 A Beautiful Phenomenon—Disease  
 and Death in Marine Life.  
 At no particular spot has the sea  
 been found to be free from organ-  
 isms, although those isolated and re-  
 cognized have proved to be harm-  
 less, consisting of active motile rods  
 and vibrios, except being less numer-  
 ous. As might be expected, the num-  
 ber of organisms increases immen-  
 sely as the shore is approached. Thus  
 about a mile from the shore some-  
 thing like 4,000 germs per cubic  
 centimetre have been found, and this  
 influence of the shore extends for  
 four or five miles. Some hundreds of  
 miles from land the number dimi-  
 nishes to 600 and at greater distances  
 to 200 or less.  
 Of course, the fact that algal vege-  
 tation is richest near the shore, pro-  
 viding a highly nourishing hunting  
 ground for the marine organisms, ac-  
 counts for the myriads usually found  
 there. Samples of sea water taken  
 at some depth below the surface  
 proved to contain only a few bac-  
 teria per cubic centimetre. Thus at  
 half a mile below the surface only  
 from twelve to eight bacteria were  
 present. There is little doubt that  
 even should pathogenic organisms  
 gain access to the sea, as must be  
 the case when sewers discharge raw  
 sewage into it, their activity, must  
 sooner or later be destroyed.  
 The sea is remarkable from a bac-  
 teriological point of view in contain-  
 ing phosphorescent bacteria, and it  
 is probable that some of these are  
 disease producing, so far, at any  
 rate, as regards certain aquatic ani-  
 mals. Thus a bacterium has been  
 successfully cultivated from the body  
 of the luminous tautog which is  
 both pathogenic and luminous. This  
 bacterium invades the abdominal cav-  
 ity of this aquatic animal and all  
 its organs with a fatal issue. Dur-  
 ing the presence of the disease the  
 victim shines with a green light,  
 which is said to be visible nearly  
 a dozen yards away and which per-  
 sists for some hours after the de-  
 mise of the animal. It is not improb-  
 able that the luminosity of other  
 marine animals may be due to the  
 invasion of this light and disease-  
 producing organism.  
 The presence of highly combustible  
 matter increases the light. A very  
 simple experiment proves this. If the  
 flesh of a fresh haddock or herring  
 be placed in a 3 per cent. salt solu-  
 tion and kept at a low temperature  
 (from 40 to 50 degrees Fahrenheit)  
 the liquid will rapidly develop phos-  
 phorescence, which becomes quite  
 brilliant on adding a little glycerine  
 or sugar, or what, in other words,  
 is respirable material. It is curious  
 that in marine life disease and death  
 should be associated with luminous  
 phenomena.—From The Lancet.
