## Vote To Decide Women's Status For Ordination

### United Church Presbyteries Voting on Issue of Admission of Fair Sex to Ministry of Denomination

TORONTO, March 6.—(C.P.—) Attention of church, feminist, suffragist and other organizations is focussed on the United Church of Canada whose presbyteries from coast to coast are voting on the question as to whether the ministry of the church shall be open to women as well as men.

If a vote in favor of the ordination of women is cast by two-thirds of the 114 presbyteries of the United Church before June 1 next, it is expected that legislation providing for the opening of the ministry in that denomination to women will become effective in 1936.

In the United Church the question of ordination of women arose in its present form when the Saskatchewan Conference in 1934 voted that unless objection was taken by the church as a whole the Conference would proceed to ordain Miss Lydia E. Gruchy, B.A. who for 11 years has served as a missionary pastor on northern fields, without the power to perform the sacrament of marriage or other church rites.

The General Council, meeting at Kingston last September, adopted the necessary permissive legislation and ordered a remit or referendum to the presbyteries under the Barrier Act.

Prior to church union, Miss Gruchy who was a graduate in arts and theology, had served under the Presbyterian Church in Canada. In the Methodist Church ordination of women was discussed in the General Conference of 1922 without gain to the advocates of woman's ministry.

#### Discussed in 1924

After union the Saskatchewan Conference of 1924 requested the second General Council meeting in the same year at Montreal, "to grant authority to this Conference to ordain Miss Lydia E. Gruchy to the ministry of the United Church of Canada." The Council consulted its law and legislation committee, which expressed the opinion that serious legal doubts existed regarding the right of the United Church to ordain women without first obtaining the approval of the presbyteries.

In the vote subsequently taken on the principle, 32 Presbyteries were favorable, 34 opposed and 23 favored the principle but advised that action be deferred. The General Council of 1928, meeting at Winnipeg, ruled that the mind of the Church had not been fully disclosed and declared that "there is no bar in reason or religion to such ordination."

From that time until the meeting of Saskatchewan Conference last year the question was in abeyance, while the eligibility of women to become members of session was being decided.

Results of the present voting in Presbyteries are required to reach the secretary of General Council, Rev. T. Albert Moore, by the end of May.

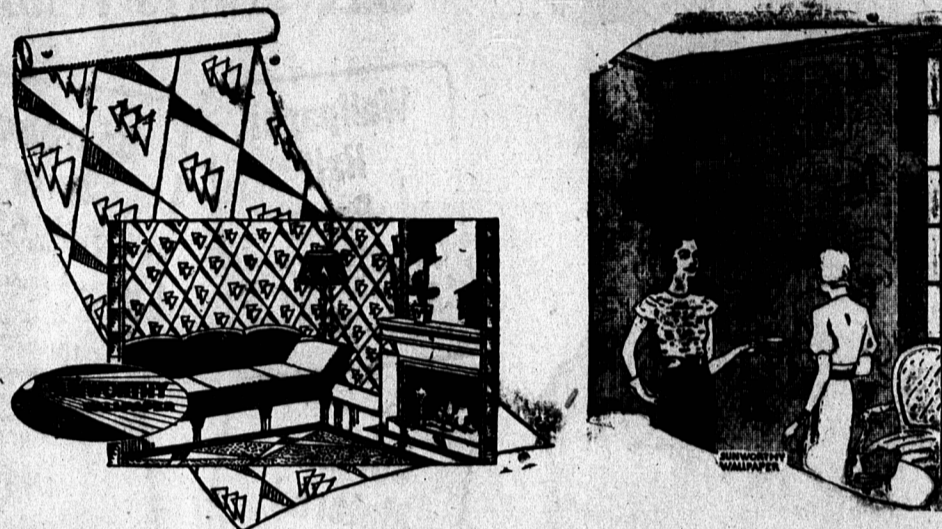
