NEW YORK, July 13—(AP)—With an 18-point gain, Ernie Lombardi, Boston Braves' big catcher, moved back into the thick of the battle for the National League batting championship last week.

While Lombardi was boosting his average to .333, Brooklyn's two pace setters, Pete Reiser and Joe McGraw, fell off slightly. Reiser dropped down five points but clung to the lead with an average of .356.
