**DR. BELL AND RADIUM CURE FOR CANCER**

VICTORIA, March 14.—Was Dr. Alexander Graham Bell, Baddeck, the first to hint at radium as a cure for cancer? There has just been brought to light a letter written by the noted inventor of the telephone more than a decade ago which is causing the scientist's many friends to wonder whether he was not the first man to suggest the employing of radium in the bodily tissue as a curative agent for deep-seated cancer. The letter dates July 21, 1903, and addressed to Dr. Z. T. Showers of Washington, has been made public by the National Geographic society of America.

Speaking of the satisfactory results radium was found to have on external cancers and at the same time of the unsatisfactory effects it had on deep seated cancers, Dr. Bell in his letter said:

"It has occurred to me that one reason for the unsatisfactory nature of these latter experiments arises from the fact that the rays have been applied externally, thus having to pass through healthy tissue of various depths in order to reach the cancerous matter. The Crooks tube, from which Roentgen rays are admitted into the middle of the mass of cancer, but there is no reason why a tiny fragment of radium sealed up in a fine glass tube should not be inserted into the heart of the cancer, thus acting directly upon the diseased material. Would it not be worth while making experiments along this line?"

Dr. Showers replied that he regarded the suggestion as very valuable, and added: "If such experiments should be made. I have no doubt they would prove successful in many cases where we now have failures."

These letters were recently called to Dr. Bell's attention, but he declined to claim that this was the first suggestion. He added, however, that should an investigation prove this to be true nothing would please him more.

While they had not been able to find exact data on the subject physicians in the office of the surgeon-general of the war department are of the opinion that Dr. Bell's suggestion was the first of its kind to be made.
