A Handsome Donation.—At a special meeting of the Hospital Board held last night in the City Hall which was called for the purpose of discussing matters, the following letter was read before the Board:—

R. E. A. LEICH,

Sec'y of the Brandon General Hospital.  
DEAR SIR,—I wish to present to the Brandon Hospital, in memory of my husband, the static electric machine, with its X rays apparatus from which in his life time he derived so much satisfaction.

While wishing that the machine may be used free in all charitable cases, I yet desire to make the stipulation that when used by physicians in their private practice a portion of the charge made should be paid to the Hospital Fund.

I should also like to suggest, that at the first convenient opportunity, one or more of the doctors in connection with the Hospital, should take a course in static electricity as applied to therapeutics the expenses of such course to be defrayed or partially so by the hospital.

While in Ottawa I intend having a brass plate engraved with the following inscription which I shall forward, and which I would request might be fastened on the front of the machine:

"Presented to the Brandon Hospital, in Memory of

B. F. W. HURDMAN, M. D., C. M.,  
Died at Brandon, March 28th, 1901."

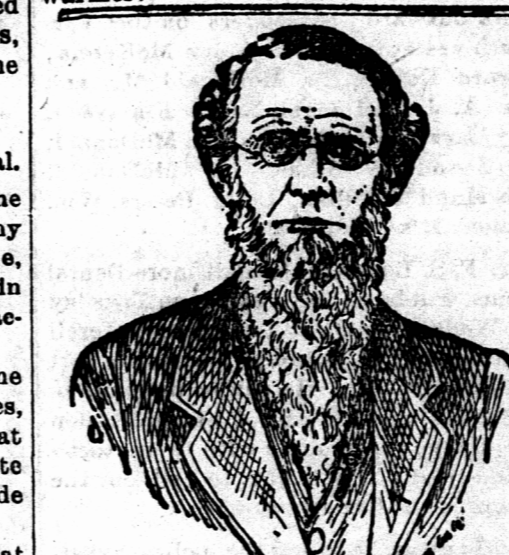
Rev. Francis E. Klander, Saratoga Springs came to the city yesterday evening by the Princess and leaves this morning for Summerside.
