THE BAPTIST CHURCH

In recognition of Remembrance Day the morning sermon by the Rev. Harvey L. Denton, B. D., was "Twenty Years After." For many years we have gathered each eleventh November, before weathing monuments to recall and pay tribute to those who gave the last full measure of devotion and to pray that nevermore shall this world experience the evil and futility of war.

It is a time of remembrance of the horror and carnage of war, the gallant self sacrifice of the men who served, with thankfulness for those who returned, with sad regret for those who lie beneath the crosses in a foreign land.

There are things that we must see afresh. War lifts once more its head in China, Spain, the Holy

Land. The nations of the world pile up armaments. It is a time of dangerous ideologies of the supremacy of state, of the threat to democracy.

There are some things to which we must pledge ourselves: Freedom, Justice, Liberty must not perish from the earth and preservation of these is the task of democracy. We must see that the need of each nation is the problem of all nations. Praying for peace, we must pledge ourselves to the ways of God. As the world forgets God, it descends into Hell. "Lord God of hosts, be with us yet, lest we forget, lest we forsake."

Benson's "O Lord of Hosts" was expressively sung by Miss Vera Campbell. The morning anthem was Thiman's "Earth does not hold." A memorial wreath was placed before the bronze tablet to those of this

church who died in France.

The fifth of a series of sermons on "Some Saints and Some Sinners" was delivered by the Rev. H. L. Denton, whose subject for the evening sermon was "The man who had too many wives." The evening anthem was Vaughan Williams' "For All The Saints." Mr. J. E. Sterns gave an impressive rendering of Kipling's "God of our Fathers."
