'THE SECRET OF MY SUCCESS'

One of Boston's Leading Dressmakers, Mrs. Jessie Higgins, Formerly of Tryon, Tells of Her Business.

A late issue of the Boston Sunday Globe contains an illustrated article on "The Secret of My Success" in which one of the leading dressmakers of Boston, Mrs. Jessie Higgins, formerly Miss Jessie Gouldrup, Tryon, who commenced with a small beginning 12 years ago, tells the newspaper writer some of the details of her large business.

"There is no secret," she answered in reply to a question, "it is simple work, hard work and strict attention to business. Of course, I don't mean by that that any one could start as I did and achieve my success. In the first place, I had the knack of putting things together, of knowing just what touch was needed to complete a costume. Perhaps that is the secret; if so it can never be divulged, because it is something that is born in one, just like the talent for painting, writing or music."

Mrs. Higgins says that she treats her girls as she would have her own daughters treated. She looks upon them as human beings and not machines and as a result they never fall her. They have large well ventilated rooms with all conveniences for lunching at noon hour if they wish to take advantage of them.

The establishment consists of a series of fitting rooms where skillful fingers adjust the garments to give the best possible effect; the plating room where two large machines, each costing over \$1000 convert flimsy nets, chiffons and silks into knife plaited and accordion plaited shimmering folds; and the work room where a busy scene is presented but where the work is so systematized that no noise or confusion prevails.

The proprietress said she averaged five gowns a day but many more in the busy season; but this however, brings such excellent returns that she recently refused an offer of \$5000 a year to superintend this branch of work in another store. She does all her own buying and goes to Paris each year to get the little touches, the combinations of color and the drapings that lead to her personal superintendence of every garment an experience that is not excelled.

JUST HOW WE STAND.

The following is an extract from a speech delivered by B. Hal. Brown, Manager of the London & Lancashire Life Insurance Co. for Canada:

CONSERVATIVES ARE TO CONVENE

OTTAWA, Nov. 27.—A Dominion Conservative convention will be held next autumn, probably in Winnipeg. It is proposed to have a full representation of the party from all parts of Canada, and to take the eastern members of the party to the gateway of the west, there to get in touch with the new problem which the development of the west entails. During the session it was decided to hold the convention in the autumn of 1906, and a committee of members, headed by H. B. Ames, was appointed to make the arrangements. Matters are now sufficiently advanced to make the announcement. The present plan is to summon the gathering for the early autumn, probably late in August or early in September.

MARITIME WINTER FAIR.

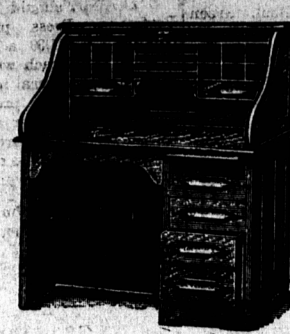

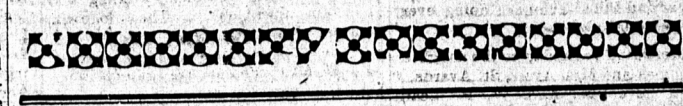
