# SUM'SIDE WATERWORKS

And Sewerage Estimates as Obtained From

Prof. R. S. Lea, C. E.

MATTER FOR ALL CITIZENS TO CONSIDER.

The Present Probable Cost, Based on Pictou and Charlottetown Prices, as Compared With the Estimates of 1897—an Increase of \$6,493.90.

It will be remembered that in 1897 Mr. R. S. Lea, C. E., Montreal, was employed by the Town Council to survey the Town for estimates on waterworks and sewerage. Plans and specifications were made and placed in the possession of the town at considerable cost. The estimates then seeming too high the matter was deferred for a time. The agitation began again some few months ago and the matter was considered by the Council when it found that the plans (blue prints) were missing, and the clerk was ordered to search for them. This has been done but the Town is yet without the plans. In the meantime one of the Councillors communicated with Mr. Lea and a day or two ago to receive another copy of the plans, which the engineer was good enough to furnish the town, with free of charge. The estimates made out by him shortly after the survey are still in the Town's possession. But as the price of building material has changed somewhat Mr. Lea has also sent new figures. In his letter Mr. Lea writes:

I am sending you by this mail blue prints of the plans which accompanied my reports on the water and sewerage systems for Summerside made in 1897. I have also made a comparison of the probable cost of these works at the present time with that given in the estimates referred to, which is based on the bids for the material for the Pictou waterworks received January 3rd, 1901, and on the cost of constructing sewers in Charlottetown during the summer of 1900. As you know the prices of most building material are considerably higher now than in 1897 especially the price of iron. They are, however, lower now than during the intervening years 1899 and 1900.

This comparison is made on the basis stated—Pictou and Charlottetown prices—with the exception of the standpipes the bids for which (at Pictou) are not yet in. The total increase in both systems in thus nearly \$6800 over the probable cost in 1897. In connection with this subject I might suggest that if permanent improvements in street paving are contemplated, it would be better to defer such work until after the water and sewer pipes are laid, otherwise it will have to be done over again, to a considerable extent.
