WASHING BRUSHED WOOL

Any garment of brushed wool must be washed carefully. Make a luke-warm water and wash water. Squeeze the garment in the luke-warm water, wring it out, rinse thoroughly, adding a few soap flakes to the last rinsing. Spread out flat to dry turning the garment when one side is dry.

LITTLE EGG DISH FOR TWO

1 tablespoon butter
1/4 cup milk
1/2 cup cheese
2 eggs

In a saucepan melt the butter, add the milk and pepper to taste. Next add the cheese cut in quite small pieces and stir until the cheese has completely melted.

Fry this rich, creamy sauce in well-buttered ramekins or individual baking dishes. Carefully drop 1 egg in each dish in the centre of the sauce, being sure not to break the yolk.

Set the dish in a moderate oven and bake for about 5 minutes, until the egg has set.

This little dish is excellent for a simple luncheon.

EGGS TRINIDAD

Parboil 1 large green pepper about 3 minutes, drain and chop. Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a pan over hot water. Add 5 beaten eggs, 3 tablespoons cream, the chopped pepper and salt to taste. Cook until creamy, stirring continuously. Be careful not to overcook. Keep warm over hot water if necessary. This makes 3 servings.

Dad's Duty To Daughter

Father Should Be Broad-Minded Yet Advises Her On Boys

These lines are addressed to the fathers of young girls: Listen, Pop, have you ever thought about being anything but a cash register to your girls? Have you ever tried to help them shape their lives so as to get happiness out of them? Have you ever attempted to teach them anything about men, and how to pick out husband and keep him after they get him?

Ninety per cent of the fathers in the world would have to answer NO, if they replied honestly to these questions; yet they adore their Sallies and Susies and work their fingers to the bones to buy them pretty clothes and give them good times, but they don't try to understand them, or guide them. Every father, worthy of the name, feels it his duty to give his girls a hand up at the beginning of their careers, but he expects his girls to be self-starters. Indeed, instead of helping them, he so often handicaps them by his antiquated prejudices and petty tyrannies and personal selfishness that they cannot compete in the race with girls whose fathers are helpers instead of hindrances to them.

NEED PARENTAL HELP
