This colt has been a blue ribbon prize winner in the show ring, also his mother before him, and his little sister, Aggie Echo, by Echo Todd, 2.14¾. This stallion should be a great benefit to Island breeders.

The Queen's Canadian Military Hospital was organized at the commencement of the war by Canadians in London, England, for the special purpose of treating Canadian wounded. Sir William Osler, Bart., F.R.S., is Physician-in-Chief, and the hospital is managed by a representative committee of which Mr. George McLaren Brown is chairman. It is beautifully situated at Beachborough Park, which is being kindly loaned for the purpose by Sir Arthur and Lady Markham.

The hospital, which is supported by voluntary contributions of friends in England and Canada, is urgently in need of funds and of all kinds of surgical supplies and dressings, especially gauze bandages.
