APPEAL TO BE TAKEN IN BECKER CASE.

NEW YORK, October 25—Police Lieutenant Charles Becker spent his hours of confinement in the Tombs today, planning his fight to annul the verdict of the jury which convicted him last night for the murder of the gambler Herman Rosenthal. Becker has lost none of the iron nerve which bore him thru the trial and the ordeal of hearing himself condemned as guilty, if his appearance and every action today count for anything. He awoke refreshed from a sound sleep and after a hearty breakfast, summoned his chief attorney, John F. McIntyre.

The two conferred for more than an hour, and later Mr. McIntyre announced that immediate notice of appeal from the verdict would be filed. Becker, who is due to be sentenced next Wednesday, would if the usual procedure were followed, take his seat in the electric chair the first week in December. The filing of the notice, however, will act as a stay, and it is not impossible that

months may lead them into years before the fate of the convicted police officer is decided. A recent case occupied two years before the appeal of a first degree murder verdict was settled.

I don't mind saying that we expect a reversal, Becker's attorney announced. The appeal will be on the grounds that the verdict was against the weight of evidence, that the justice's charge was of a nature to injure the chances of the defendant, upon the justice's failure to rule that Sam Scheppe was an accomplice in the murder, and upon the error of law with the refusal of the justice to allow testimony submitted by the defense to go in the records.

TO PRESERVE STANDARDS IN FOOD OF THE PEOPLE.

OTTAWA, Oct. 25.—Notice appears in the Canada Gazette of the fixing of standards of quality in a number of products. This step is taken under the Adulteration act and among the products defined as to quality are honey, fruits, dried fruits, evaporated fruit, preserves, jam, marmalade, fruit butter, fruit jelly, canned peas and flavoring extracts. In cases where jam, marmalade, etc., contain other fruits or fruit other than that which gives its special name to the article, the fact is to be stated on the label, in letters as large and distinct as those used in naming the fruit, principally present. The presence of glucose instead of sugar is to be noted. Canned peas are to be prepared of peas from the harvest of the year in which they are prepared unless peas. If ripe peas are used the fact must be plainly stated. Lead is to have no added coloring matter.

TO KEEP NAVIGATION OF RIVER TO LATE PERIOD.

OTTAWA, October 25—Vessel men are still negotiating with underwriters concerning the keeping of navigation open after December 15. During the past two days there have been storms on the St. Lawrence with the result that at different parts of the river the water has risen 23 feet higher than the same time last year. This is taken as a good indication for longer navigation, and will do a great deal towards abolishing the anxiety usually felt at this period.

H. M. S. CORNWALL LOSES A DRILL TORPEDO.

HALIFAX, Oct. 27.—H. M. S. Cornwall, which has been in port for a week, spent all yesterday in the face of a south-east gale, in searching for a lost drill torpedo which has gone to the bottom of the harbor. Had it not been for this loss the Cornwall would have sailed for St. John yesterday.

The rules of the admiralty are that a lost torpedo must be searched for during a period of seven days before abandoning it, but where there is another warship available to take up the search this work may be passed over to her. If the Cornwall fails in locating the torpedo with her grapple irons this forenoon, the Grapple will take up the search and allow the Cornwall to proceed to St. John, where she has been ordered by the admiralty. Thereafter she will proceed to the West Indies. A reward of \$20 is offered for the recovery of the torpedo.

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION REPORT COMES NEXT YEAR.

OTTAWA, October 25—The work of the Public Service Commission appointed to consider possible reforms in the civil will, it is expected, be considered early in the new year. Since the resignation of A. B. Morse, the work of the commission has been conducted by the two remaining commissioners, R. S. Lake and G. H. Ducharme. The commission has lately been cooperating with Sir George Murray, who came out from England at the instance of the Borden government, and has been studying methods of administration at Ottawa.
